
QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 JUNE 2026

Exploration

- Drilling program finalised for key gold targets at Morck Well; heritage surveys completed on the 21st of July and drilling anticipated to commence in late August.
- Commenced conceptual mining optimisation studies at the Forrest copper and gold deposit to determine the best pathway for progressing the resources.
- Auris continues to evaluate new strategic opportunities to enhance shareholder value.

Corporate

- Cash balance at 30 June 2026 of \$3.05million.

Gold and base metals explorer **Auris Minerals Limited** (“Auris” or “the Company”) (ASX: AUR) is pleased to provide its Quarterly Activities Report for the quarter ended 30 June 2026.

Commenting on the June quarter, Auris Managing Director, Mike Hendriks said:

"Having completed heritage surveying of planned drill lines on 21 July 2026, we anticipate heritage approval to be forthcoming, allowing us to commence drilling at Jacques East and Frenchy's South, following extensive work prioritising key targets across both projects.

We've also been reviewing the optionality around extracting value from our Forrest copper deposit, particularly in light of the rise in copper price over the past 12 months. CCR Mining Engineering Pty Ltd have been engaged to outline potential mining options at the project.

The Company remains well funded, and we continue to evaluate a range of projects that would complement our existing tenure and add shareholder value."

Company Overview

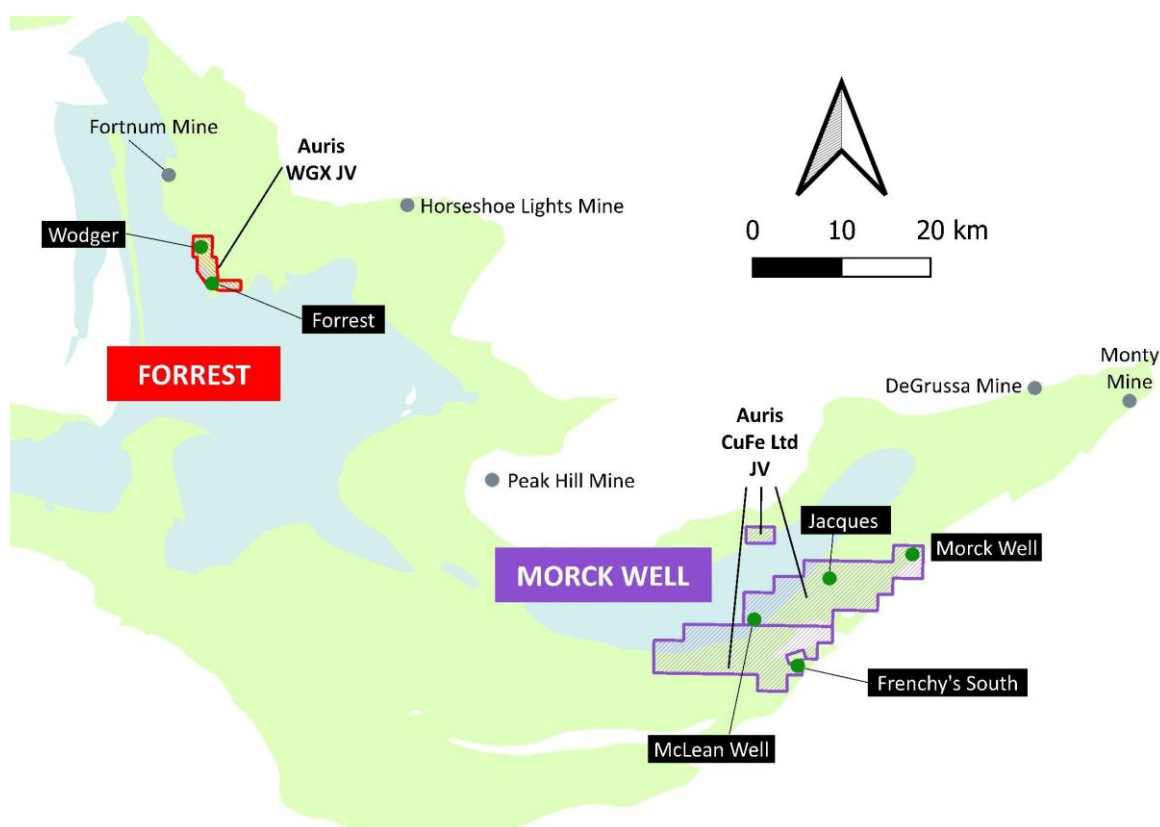


Figure 1: Auris' copper-gold exploration tenement portfolio, with Westgold (WGX) and CuFe Ltd JV areas indicated (as of 30 June 2026)

Auris is exploring for base metals and gold in the Bryah Basin of Western Australia. Auris has consolidated a tenement portfolio of ~223km², which at 30 June 2026, was divided into two well-defined project areas: Forrest and Morck Well, (Figure 1).

Auris manages exploration on all tenements, including those that are subject to arrangements with third parties.

1. EXPLORATION

Exploration activities conducted during the reporting period related to planning future exploration programs to advance strategic gold, copper, manganese and other base metal targets on our existing tenements.

Following completion of a detailed exploration and prospectivity review across the Company's existing tenure, the Company has finalised its upcoming drill program, which will test high-priority gold targets at Morck Well.

The Company eagerly anticipates the commencement of an air core drilling program within its Morck Well Tenement Group (E51/1033 and E52/1672) to follow up previous gold anomalism at the Jacques East and Frenchy's South prospects. The program will comprise 20–26 drill holes. At Jacques East, initial drilling will be completed at 100m spacing for 20 holes, as depicted on the plans below, with any areas of significant quartz veining or alteration immediately infilled to 50m spacing. The Jacques East gold prospect has historically intersected gold mineralisation and is interpreted to host a flat-lying supergene component associated with regolith boundaries (refer ASX announcements 17 July 2020 and 8 August 2023).

At Frenchy's South, drilling will test the distribution and tenor of gold mineralisation at a closer spacing (25m spacing from historical drilling) for a total of 6 holes. Frenchy's South has historically returned anomalous gold mineralisation over 1.2km (refer ASX announcements 16 April 2019 and 8 August 2023).

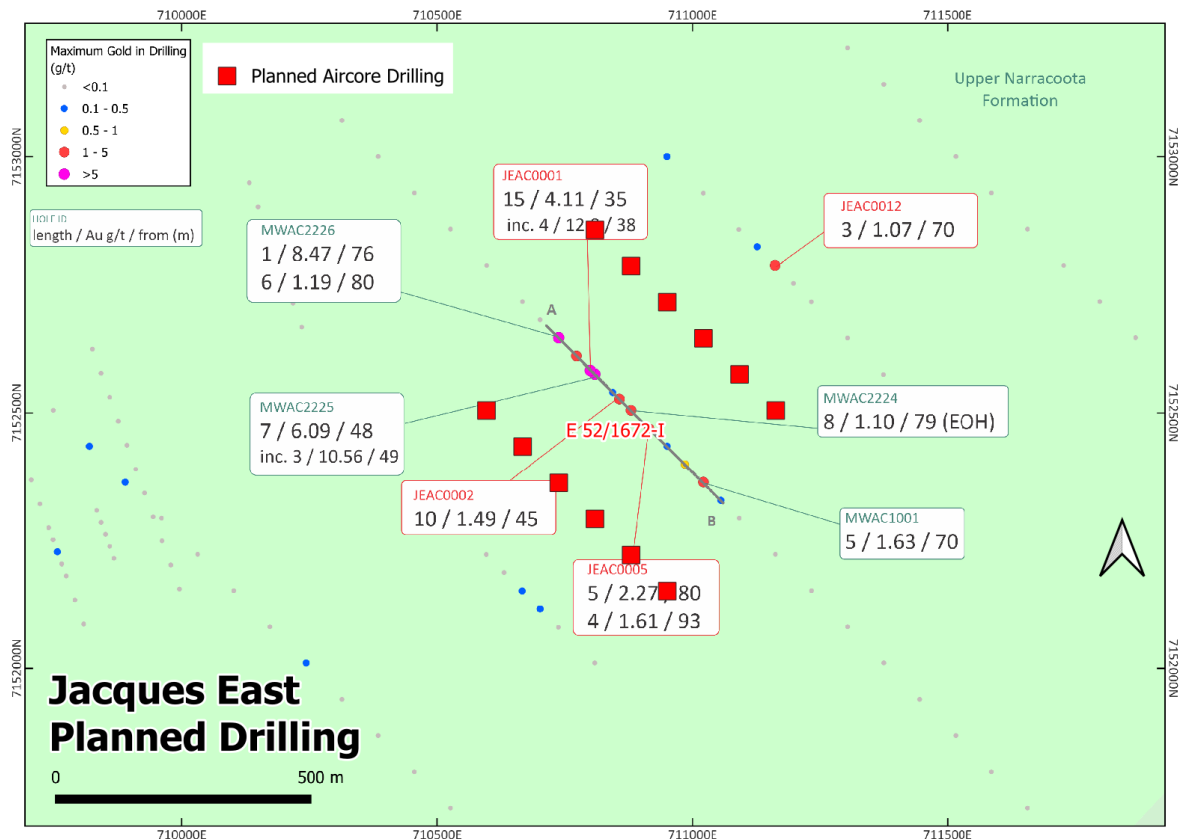


Figure 2: Jacques East Prospect Drilling Plan (ASX Announcement 8 August 2023 for previous results)

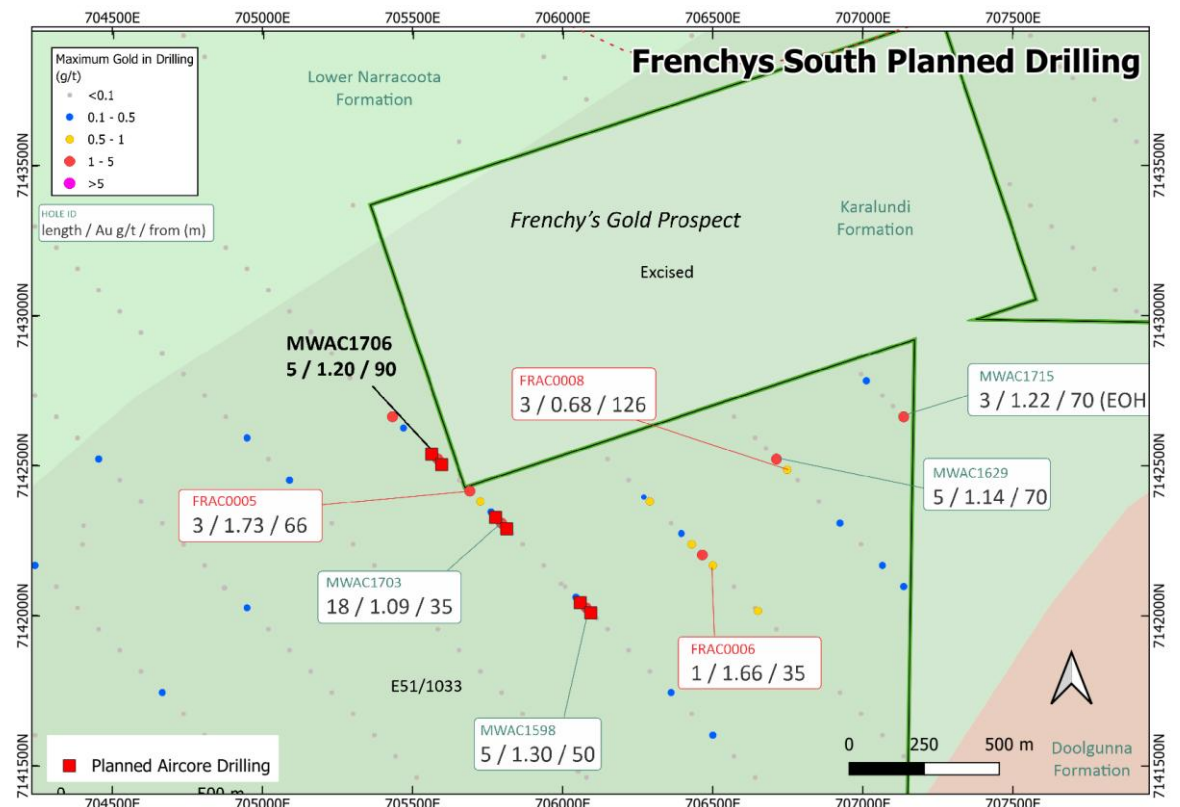


Figure 3: Frenchy's South Prospect Drilling Plan (ASX Announcement 8 August 2023 for previous results)

Heritage surveying of the planned drill lines was completed on 21 July 2026, and Auris is currently awaiting heritage clearance in order to book in drilling, with drilling contractors already on standby. The Company anticipates drilling will commence in late August.

Concurrently, we continue to undertake conceptual mining optimisation studies on the Forrest project resources, to determine how best to progress this resource towards mining. CCR Mining Engineering Pty Ltd (CCR) have been engaged to provide an independent review of potential mining options at Forrest. The scope of work will include copper only, gold only and combined copper/gold. With the assistance of the findings from CCR, Auris will undertake further analysis in consultation with Westgold Resources who's interests are outlined in Figure 1 above, before determining next steps.

The resources estimated at Forrest and Wodger deposits comprise a total inferred resource of 2.4 Mt @ 1.7% Cu and 0.44g/t Au for 41,500 t Cu and 34,300 oz Au.

The Company continues to evaluate a number of potential project opportunities.

The Company had a cash position of \$3.05M at 30 June 2026.

The \$559k of exploration and evaluation and tenement expenditure is comprised of costs incurred on geological staff salaries, tenement administration and project evaluation, and final settlement of an outstanding stamp duty dispute (refer to Note 6 in the Auris Minerals, Interim Consolidated Financial Report for the half year ended 31 December 2025 lodged on ASX, 25 February 2026.)

No production and development activities were undertaken during the quarter.
