Large Enterprise Tariff Loan ("LETL") facility:

In December 2025, Arctic Canadian Diamond Company Ltd. (100% owned subsidiary of Burgundy Diamonds Mines Ltd.) secured up to A\$119.9 million (C\$115.0 million) loan through Canada's Large Enterprise Tariff Loan facility. The LETL facility is managed by the Canada Enterprise Emergency Funding Corporation ("CEEFC"). As of 31 December 2025, A\$49.4 million (C\$45.0 million) of the LETL facility had been drawn and the remaining amount was drawn during the quarter ended 31 March 2026. The loan facility has a maturity date of 17 December 2032. The loan interest rate is calculated by taking the quarterly Canadian Overnight Repo Rate Average ("CORRA") rate plus the applicable margin that is 2% up to but excluding 31 December 2027, 4% from 31 December 2027 up to but excluding 29 December 2028, 6% from 31 December 2028 up to but excluding 29 December 2029, 8% from 31 December 2029 up to but excluding 31 December 2030 and 10% from 31 December 2030 up until maturity date. Interest payable in the initial two years of the loan facility can be capitalised as PIK interest (and is payable upon maturity). All material assets of Arctic Canadian Diamond Company Ltd. (excluding those pledged under the fuel financing arrangement) are pledged under the LETL facility.

During the quarter ended 31 March, 2026 the LETL facility was further extended by another A\$61.5 million (C\$60.0 million), which was drawn by 30 June, 2026. The terms of this extended LETL facility are the same as noted above for the initial LETL facility.

Debtor-in-possession ("DIP") facility

During Q2, 2026, Burgundy's subsidiary Arctic Canadian Diamond Company Ltd, received a non-revolving credit facility (DIP) facility for an aggregate principal amount of C\$60.0 million to be received in two tranches. The first tranche will be up to C\$10.0 million and second tranche will be up to C\$60.0 million. The second tranche of the facility was not made available to Arctic Canadian Diamond Company Ltd. The DIP is to be repaid on the earlier of (i) occurrence of event of default, (ii) closing of one or more sale transactions for all or substantially all of the assets of Arctic Canadian Diamond Company Ltd as approved by an order of the Court and (iii) 20 November, 2026.

The outstanding principal amount of all DIP Advances shall bear interest at a rate per annum equal to 14.5% (the "Interest Rate"), and upon the occurrence and during the continuance of an Event of Default, the Interest Rate shall be increased by an additional 2% per annum, calculated and payable monthly in arrears on the last Business Day of each calendar month.

2L Loan facility

The 2nd Lien Credit Agreement Loan ("2L Loan) of A\$107.3 million (US\$73.8 million) was amended in December 2025 and now has a revised maturity date of 17 December, 2033 (changed from original maturity date of 30 June 2026), the interest rate in the 2L Loan facility which was originally 10% interest per annum payable upon maturity of the loan was amended to reflect the same interest rate and interest terms as the LETL loan. The 2L Loan is subordinated under the LETL loan facility.
