**QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT
PERIOD ENDED 30 JUNE 2026**

ChemX Materials Limited (ASX: CMX) (**CMX** or the **Company**) provides its quarterly activities report for the period ended 30 June 2026.

Operational

During the reporting period, the Company remained focused on maintaining adequate working capital to develop and test recapitalisation and restructuring models to take advantage of property acquisition and development opportunities.

Board Changes

On 21 May 2026, the Company announced the appointment of Mr Paul Bernasconi as a non-executive director of the Company, effective 21 May 2026. Mr Bernasconi is an experienced property development professional with senior-level expertise across residential, commercial and retail projects, specialising in development management, project management and design management.

Mr Bernasconi will be remunerated from the non-executive director remuneration pool. A copy of Mr Bernasconi's Initial Director's Interest Notice has been lodged with the ASX. For further information refer to the ASX announcement released on 21 May 2026.

Financing

As previously announced, the Company continues to be funded under the unsecured loan agreement with an independent third party Ovay Pty Ltd (**Ovay**), which formalises the financing arrangements required to support the Company's operational obligations and the progression of its recapitalisation and restructuring activities.

Total funding available under the Agreement is capped at \$1.2m.

During the quarter additional funding provided was \$201k and at the end of the quarter the Company had \$645k funding available under the Agreement.

Financial Reporting

The Company is pleased to advise that it is now up to date with its financial reporting obligations under the ASX Listing Rules and the Corporations Act. During the quarter, the Company prepared and lodged its quarterly reports for the period ended 31 March 2026, and has commenced preparation of its annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2026.

Suspension from Trading

The Company's shares remained in suspension from trading on the Australian Securities Exchange (ASX) for the duration of the quarter and, as at the date of this report, remain suspended from trading since 19 December 2024. As noted above, the Board of Directors continue to progress plans for a potential return to trading of the Company's shares on the ASX in due course.

ASX Listing Rules

The Company notes that pursuant to:

- ASX Listing Rule 5.3.1, no exploration activities occurred during the quarter, and
- ASX listing Rule 5.3.5, payments to related parties and their associates outlined in the Company's Appendix 5B for the quarter totalled \$80k comprising consulting fees paid to a director related entity.

The key terms of the unsecured facility are as follows: • maturity date: 13 March 2027, • interest rate: 15% per annum, and • settlement: The Facility Limit (including interest) will convert to fully paid ordinary shares at the issue price of future capital raising in connection with the relisting of the Company.
