VENUE

The Annual General Meeting of the Shareholders of Dynamic Metals Limited, to which this Notice of Annual General Meeting relates, will be held at 1.00 pm (WST) on Thursday, 20 November 2025 at Rottneest Room, Automic Group, Level 5, 191 St George's Terrace, Perth WA 6000.

YOUR VOTE IS IMPORTANT

The business of the Annual General Meeting affects your shareholding and your vote is important.

VOTING ELIGIBILITY

The Directors have determined that the persons eligible to vote at the Annual General Meeting are those who are registered Shareholders at 4.00 pm (WST) on Tuesday, 18 November 2025.

VOTING IN PERSON

To vote in person, attend the Annual General Meeting on the date and at the place set out above.

VOTING BY PROXY

To vote by proxy, please complete and sign the enclosed Proxy Form and return by the time and in accordance with the instructions set out on the Proxy Form.

In accordance with section 249L of the Corporations Act, members are advised:

- each member has a right to appoint a proxy;
- the proxy need not be a member of the Company; and
- a member who is entitled to cast 2 or more votes may appoint 2 proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the member appoints 2 proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the Corporations Act, each proxy may exercise one-half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware changes to the Corporations Act made in 2011 mean that:

- if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and
- any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

Further details on these changes are set out below.

Proxy vote if appointment specifies way to vote

Section 250BB(1) of the Corporations Act provides an appointment of a proxy may specify the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution and, **if it does:**

- the proxy need not vote on a show of hands, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed); and
- if the proxy has 2 or more appointments that specify different ways to vote on the resolution – the proxy must not vote on a show of hands; and
- if the proxy is the chair of the meeting at which the resolution is voted on – the proxy must vote on a poll, and must vote that way (i.e. as directed); and
- if the proxy is not the chair – the proxy need not vote on the poll, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed).

Transfer of non-chair proxy to chair in certain circumstances

Section 250BC of the Corporations Act provides that, if:

- an appointment of a proxy specifies the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution at a meeting of the Company's members; and

- the appointed proxy is not the chair of the meeting; and
- at the meeting, a poll is duly demanded, or is otherwise required under section 250JA of the Corporations Act, on the resolution; and
- either of the following applies:
 - the proxy is not recorded as attending the meeting;
 - the proxy does not vote on the resolution,

the chair of the meeting is taken, before voting on the resolution closes, to have been appointed as the proxy for the purposes of voting on the resolution at the meeting.

CHAIR'S VOTING INTENTIONS

The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of all Resolutions, unless a Shareholder has expressly indicated a different voting intention.

Subject to the following paragraph, if the Chair is appointed as your proxy and you have not specified the way the Chair is to vote on any of the Resolutions by signing and returning the Proxy Form, you are considered to have provided the Chair with an express authorisation for the Chair to vote the proxy in accordance with the Chair's intention, even if the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel of the Company.

If the Chair is a person referred to in the voting prohibition statement applicable to a Resolution under section 224 of the Corporations Act, the Chair will only be able to cast a vote as proxy for you on the relevant Resolution if you are entitled to vote and have specified your voting intention in the Proxy Form.

ORDINARY BUSINESS

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

To receive and consider the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2025 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as set out in the Annual Report for the year ended 30 June 2025."

Note: The vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company. Shareholders are encouraged to read the Explanatory Statement for further details on the consequences of voting on this Resolution.

Voting prohibition statement:

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the **voter**) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Shareholders should note that the Chair intends to vote any undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 1. In exceptional circumstances, the Chair of the Meeting may change his or her voting intention on Resolution 1, in which case an ASX announcement will be made. Shareholders may also choose to direct the Chair to vote against Resolution 1 or to abstain from voting.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF A DIRECTOR – MR LINDSAY DUDFIELD

To consider and if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of clause 7.2(b)(iv) of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.5 and for all other purposes, Mr Lindsay Dudfield, a Director, retires by rotation, and being eligible, is re-elected as a Director of the Company."

8. RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **special resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, Shareholder approval is given for the Company to issue up to that number of Equity Securities equal to 10% of the Company's issued capital (at the time of issue), calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and otherwise on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

Voting exclusion statement:

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of this Resolution, if at the time of the Meeting, the Company is proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2, by or on behalf of any persons who are expected to participate in, or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of, the proposed issue (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- (a) a person as a proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

4. RESOLUTION 4 – APPROVAL OF ISSUE OF PERFORMANCE RIGHTS TO KAREN WELLMAN

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.14 and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of Performance Rights to Karen Wellman (or her nominee/s) under the Plan, on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

Voting exclusion statement:

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of this Resolution by or on behalf of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.14.1, 10.14.2 or 10.14.3 who is eligible to participate in the employee incentive scheme in question, or any of their respective associates.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- (a) a person as a proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or

- (b) the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

- (a) the proxy is the Chair; and
- (b) the appointment expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

5. RESOLUTION 5 – APPROVAL OF ISSUE OF DIRECTOR OPTIONS

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolutions each as separate **ordinary resolutions**:

"That, for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.14, sections 195(4) and 208 of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of up to 3,000,000 Options to the Directors as follows:

- (a) *up to 500,000 Director Options to Justin Mannolini;*
- (b) *up to 2,000,000 Director Options to Karen Wellman; and*
- (c) *up to 500,000 Director Options to Lindsay Dudfield,*

(or their respective nominee/s) under the Plan, on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

Voting exclusion statement:

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the relevant Resolution by or on behalf of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.14.1, 10.14.2 or 10.14.3 who is eligible to participate in the employee incentive scheme in question, or any of their respective associates.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the relevant Resolution by:

- (a) a person as a proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or

Voting prohibition statement:

In accordance with section 250BD of the Corporations Act, a person appointed as a proxy must not vote, on the basis of that appointment, on the relevant Resolution if:

- (a) the proxy is either a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such member; and
- (b) the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

- (a) the proxy is the Chair; and
- (b) the appointment expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Further, in accordance with section 224 of the Corporations Act, a vote on the relevant Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of a related party of the Company to whom the Resolution would permit a financial benefit to be given, or an associate of such a related party.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

- (a) it is cast by a person as a proxy appointed by writing that specifies how the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; and
- (b) it is not cast on behalf of a related party of the Company to whom the Resolution would permit a financial benefit to be given, or an associate of such a related party.

Please note: If the Chair is a person referred to in the section 224 Corporations Act voting prohibition statement above, the Chair will only be able to cast a vote as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote if the Chair is appointed as proxy in writing and the Proxy Form specifies how the proxy is to vote on the relevant Resolution.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The purpose of this Explanatory Statement is to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions in the Notice of Meeting.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Constitution and the Corporations Act, the business of the Annual General Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial period ended 30 June 2025 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

No Resolution is required to be moved in respect of this item.

Shareholders will be given a reasonable opportunity at the Meeting to ask questions and make comments on the accounts and on the business, operations and management of the Company.

The Chairman will also provide Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask the Auditor or the Auditor's representative questions relevant to:

- (a) the conduct of the audit;
- (b) the preparation and content of the independent audit report;
- (c) the accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the accounts; and
- (d) the independence of the Auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit.

The Chairman will also allow a reasonable opportunity for the Auditor or their representative to answer any written questions submitted to the Auditor under section 250PA of the Corporations Act.

The Company is not required to provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless a Shareholder has specifically elected to receive a printed copy.

Whilst the Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report unless specifically requested to do so, Shareholders may view the Company annual financial report on its website at <https://dynamicmetals.com.au/>.

2. RESOLUTION 1 - ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

In accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act the Company is required to put to its Shareholders a resolution that the Remuneration Report as disclosed in the Company's 2025 Annual Report be adopted. The Remuneration Report is set out in the Company's 2025 Annual Report and is also available on the Company's website (<https://dynamicmetals.com.au/>).

The Remuneration Report explains the Board policies in relation to the nature and level of remuneration paid to Directors, sets out remuneration details for each Director and sets out the details of any equity-based compensation.

The Chair of the Meeting will give Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask questions about, or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

The vote on this Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

However, if at least 25% of the votes cast are against adoption of the remuneration report at two consecutive annual general meetings, the Company will be required to put a resolution to the second annual general meeting (**Spill Resolution**), to approve calling a general meeting (**Spill Meeting**). If more than 50% of Shareholders vote in favour of the Spill Resolution, the Company must then convene a Spill Meeting within 90 days of the second annual general meeting. All of the Directors who were in office when the applicable Directors' report was approved, other than the Managing Director, will need to stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting if they wish to continue as Directors.

Shareholders are urged to carefully read the Proxy Form and provide a direction to the proxy on how to vote on this Resolution.

The remuneration report for the year ended 30 June 2024 did not receive a vote of more than 25% against its adoption at the Company's last annual general meeting held on 26 November 2024. Accordingly, if at least 25% of the votes cast on Resolution 1 are against adoption of the Remuneration Report, it will not result in the Company putting a Spill Resolution to Shareholders.

The Remuneration Report explains the Board policies in relation to the nature and level of remuneration paid to Directors, sets out remuneration details for each Director and sets out the details of any equity based compensation.

The Chair of the Meeting will give Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask questions about, or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

2.2 Additional information

Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution.

Given the personal interests of all Directors in the outcome of this Resolution, the Board declines to make a recommendation to Shareholders regarding this Resolution.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR LINDSAY DUDFIELD

3.1 General

Clause 7.2 of the Constitution sets out the requirements for determining which Directors are to retire by rotation at an annual general meeting.

Listing Rule 14.5 provides that there must be an election of Directors at each annual general meeting.

Mr Lindsay Dudfield, who was last elected as a Director at the Company's 2023 annual general meeting and has held office the longest out of the Directors without re-election, retires by rotation and seeks re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

If Resolution 2 is passed, Mr Dudfield will retire at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting and will be immediately re-elected as a Director.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, Mr Dudfield will retire at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting and will not be re-elected as a Director.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Dudfield is a geologist with over 40 years' experience in multi-commodity exploration, primarily within Australia. He held senior positions with the mineral divisions of Amoco (1977-1979) and Exxon (1980-1987) and was closely involved with the delineation of the Scuddles zinc-copper mine at Golden Grove, WA. In 1987 he became a founding Director of Dalrymple Resources NL and spent the following 8 years helping acquire and explore Dalrymple's properties, leading to a number of greenfields discoveries. In late 1994 Mr Dudfield joined the Board of Horizon Mining NL (predecessor of Jindalee Lithium Limited "Jindalee"). Mr Dudfield is currently an Executive Director of Jindalee. Mr Dudfield is a member of the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, the Australian Institute of Geoscientists, the Geological Society of Australia and the Society of Economic Geologists. He is also a Non-Executive Director of Energy Metals Limited and Alchemy Resources Limited.

Mr Dudfield does not currently hold any other material directorships, other than as disclosed in this Notice.

Mr Dudfield has acknowledged to the Company that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director.

3.3 Independence

If re-elected Mr Dudfield will be considered to be an independent Director.

3.4 Board recommendation

The Board has reviewed Mr Dudfield's performance since his appointment to the Board and considers that Mr Dudfield's skills and experience will continue to enhance the Board's ability to perform its role. Accordingly, the Board (with Mr Dudfield abstaining) supports the re-election of Mr Dudfield and recommends Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE: ADDITIONAL 10% CAPACITY

4.1 General

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

However, under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity may seek shareholder approval by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25% (**7.1A Mandate**).

An 'eligible entity' means an entity which is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300,000,000 or less. The Company is an eligible entity for these purposes.

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a current market capitalisation of \$13.79 million (based on the number of Shares on issue and the closing price of Shares on the ASX on 15 October 2025).

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% placement capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A, and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

4.2 Technical Information Required by 7.1A

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.1A, the information below is provided in relation to Resolution 3:

(a) Period for which the 7.1A Mandate is valid

The 7.1A Mandate will commence on the date of the Meeting and expire on the first to occur of the following:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of this Meeting;
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; and
- (iii) the time and date of approval by Shareholders of any transaction under Listing Rule 11.1.2 (a significant change in the nature or scale of activities) or Listing Rule 11.2 (disposal of the main undertaking).

(b) Minimum Price

Any Equity Securities issued under the 7.1A Mandate must be in an existing quoted class of Equity Securities and be issued at a minimum price of 75% of the volume weighted average price of Equity Securities in that class, calculated over the 15 trading days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the entity and the recipient of the Equity Securities; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 trading days of the date in Section 7.2(b)(i), the date on which the Equity Securities are issued.

(c) Use of funds raised under the 7.1A Mandate

The Company intends to use funds raised from issues of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate towards:

- (i) exploration and evaluation of the Company's existing projects in Western Australia;
- (ii) ongoing targeting and evaluation of new exploration and growth opportunities;
- (iii) general working capital; and
- (iv) administrative expenses.

(d) Risk of Economic and Voting Dilution

Any issue of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate will dilute the interests of Shareholders who do not receive any Shares under the issue.

If Resolution 3 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues the maximum number of Equity Securities available under the 7.1A Mandate, the economic and voting dilution of existing Shares would be as shown in the table below.

The table below shows the dilution of existing Shareholders calculated in accordance with the formula outlined in Listing Rule 7.1A.2, on the basis of the closing market price of Shares and the number of Equity Securities on issue as at 15 October 2025.

The table also shows the voting dilution impact where the number of Shares on issue (Variable A in the formula) changes and the economic dilution where there are changes in the issue price of Shares issued under the 7.1A Mandate.

2. The issue price set out above is the closing market price of the Shares on the ASX on 15 October 2025 (being \$0.28).
3. The Company issues the maximum possible number of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate.
4. The Company has not issued any Equity Securities in the 12 months prior to the Meeting that were not issued under an exception in Listing Rule 7.2 or with approval under Listing Rule 7.1.
5. The issue of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate consists only of Shares. It is assumed that no Options or Performance Rights are exercised into Shares before the date of issue of the Equity Securities. If the issue of Equity Securities includes quoted Options, it is assumed that those quoted Options are exercised into Shares for the purpose of calculating the voting dilution effect on existing Shareholders.
6. The calculations above do not show the dilution that any one particular Shareholder will be subject to. All Shareholders should consider the dilution caused to their own shareholding depending on their specific circumstances.
7. This table does not set out any dilution pursuant to approvals under Listing Rule 7.1 unless otherwise disclosed.
8. The 10% voting dilution reflects the aggregate percentage dilution against the issued share capital at the time of issue. This is why the voting dilution is shown in each example as 10%.

The table does not show an example of dilution that may be caused to a particular Shareholder by reason of placements under the 7.1A Mandate, based on that Shareholder's holding at the date of the Meeting.

Shareholders should note that there is a risk that:

- (i) the market price for the Company's Shares may be significantly lower on the issue date than on the date of the Meeting; and
- (ii) the Shares may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for those Shares on the date of issue.

(e) **Allocation policy under the 7.1A Mandate**

The recipients of the Equity Securities to be issued under the 7.1A Mandate have not yet been determined. However, the recipients of Equity Securities could consist of current Shareholders or new investors (or both), none of whom will be related parties of the Company.

The Company will determine the recipients at the time of the issue under the 7.1A Mandate, having regard to the following factors:

- (i) the purpose of the issue;
- (ii) alternative methods for raising funds available to the Company at that time, including, but not limited to, an entitlement issue, share purchase plan, placement or other offer where existing Shareholders may participate;
- (iii) the effect of the issue of the Equity Securities on the control of the Company;
- (iv) the circumstances of the Company, including, but not limited to, the financial position and solvency of the Company;
- (v) prevailing market conditions; and
- (vi) advice from corporate, financial and broking advisers (if applicable).

(f) **Previous approval under Listing Rule 7.1A**

The Company previously obtained Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A on 26 November 2024 at its 2024 annual general meeting (**Previous Approval**).

During the period preceding the date of the Meeting, being on and from 26 November 2024, the Company issued no Shares pursuant to the Previous Approval (**Previous Issue**).

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is not proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A and has not approached any particular existing Shareholder or security holder or an identifiable class of existing security holder to participate in any such issue.

However, in the event that between the date of this Notice and the date of the Meeting, the Company proposes to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A to one or more existing Shareholders, those Shareholders' votes will be excluded under the voting exclusion statement in the Notice.

4.3 Additional information

Resolution 3 is a special resolution and therefore requires approval of 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote (in person, by proxy, by attorney or, in the case of a corporate Shareholder, by a corporate representative).

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – APPROVAL OF ISSUE OF PERFORMANCE RIGHTS TO KAREN WELLMAN

5.1 General

The Company is proposing, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue Performance Rights to the Company's Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer, Ms Karen Wellman (or her nominee/s), as follows:

The proposed issue of these Performance Rights seeks to align the efforts of the executive management to achieve short and long-term strategic objectives and Shareholder value creation, noting that Class D and E Performance Rights are all subject to performance-based vesting conditions.

The Board also believes that incentivising with Performance Rights is a prudent means of conserving the Company's available cash reserves. The Board believes it is important and in the best interests of Shareholders to offer these Performance Rights to continue to attract, motivate and retain highly experienced and qualified executives in a competitive market.

The Performance Rights are to be issued under the Company's Employee Securities Plan (**Plan**), the material terms of which are summarised in Annexure A.

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval for the issue of the Performance Rights under the Plan to Ms Wellman (or her nominee/s), under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.14.

5.2 Listing Rule 10.14

Listing Rule 10.14 provides that a listed company must not permit any of the following persons to acquire Equity Securities under an employee incentive scheme:

- (a) a director of the company (Listing Rule 10.14.1);
- (b) an associate of a director the company (Listing Rule 10.14.2); or
- (c) a person whose relation with the company or a person referred to in Listing Rule 10.14.1 or 10.14.2 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the acquisition should be approved by its shareholders (Listing Rule 10.14.3),

unless it obtains the approval of its shareholders.

The proposed issue of the Performance Rights falls within Listing Rule 10.14.1 (or Listing Rule 10.14.2 if Ms Wellman elects for the Performance Rights to be granted to her nominee/s) and therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 10.14.

As Shareholder approval is being sought under Listing Rule 10.14, approval under Listing Rule 7.1 or 10.11 is not required. Accordingly, the issue of the Performance Rights to Ms Wellman (or her nominee/s) will not be included in the Company's 15% annual placement capacity in Listing Rule 7.1 or the maximum permitted number of Equity Securities issued under Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b).

If Resolution 4 is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of the Performance Rights to Ms Wellman (or her nominee/s).

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Performance Rights to Ms Wellman (or her nominee/s) and the Company may need to consider other forms of performance-based remuneration, including by the payment of cash.

5.3 Specific information required by Listing Rule 10.15

Under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.15, the following information is provided in relation to the proposed issue of the Performance Rights:

- (a) the Performance Rights will be issued under the Plan to Ms Wellman (or her nominee/s);
- (b) Ms Wellman is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director and falls into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.14.1. If the Performance Rights are issued to Ms Wellman's nominee/s, that person/s will fall into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.14.2;

- (c) the maximum number of Performance Rights to be issued to Ms Wellman (or her nominee/s) under the Plan is as follows:
- (i) Class D: 250,000; and
 - (ii) Class E: The number that converts to Shares to the value of A\$40,000 using a volume weighted average price for 20 consecutive trading days on which trades of the Shares are recorded on ASX ending 30 June 2026.
- (d) the current total annual remuneration package for Ms Wellman as at the date of this Notice is \$324,800 (inclusive of superannuation);
- (e) 250,000 Class A Performance Rights, 99,338 Class B Performance Rights and 117,647 Class C Performance Rights have previously been issued under the Plan to Ms Wellman or her nominee/s (and her associates) – see Notice of 2024 Annual General Meeting lodged on ASX on 25 October 2024 for terms and conditions. Those Performance Rights were issued for nil cash consideration;
- (f) the Performance Rights will be issued on the terms and conditions set out in Annexure A and Annexure B;
- (g) the Board (with Ms Wellman abstaining) considers that Performance Rights, rather than Shares, are an appropriate form of incentive on the basis that:
- (i) the Performance Rights are designed to attract, retain and reward the executive management team for the achievement of key short and long-term business objectives for the Company;
 - (ii) Shareholders can readily ascertain and understand the vesting conditions which are required to be satisfied for Performance Rights to vest and the number of Shares to which they relate (i.e. each Performance Right is a right to be issued one Share upon the satisfaction of the relevant vesting condition); and
 - (iii) Ms Wellman will only obtain the value of the Performance Rights and be able to exercise the Performance Rights into Shares upon satisfaction of the relevant vesting condition;
- (h) the Company has valued the Performance Rights, which is set out in Annexure C, with a summary below:

- (i) the Performance Rights will be issued no later than three years after the date of the Meeting (or such later date as permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules);
- (j) the Performance Rights will have an issue price of nil as they will be issued as part of Ms Wellman's remuneration package;
- (k) a summary of the material terms of the Plan is set out in Annexure A;

- (l) no loan will be provided to Ms Wellman in relation to the issue of the Performance Rights;
- (m) details of any Securities issued under the Plan will be published in the annual report of the Company relating to a period in which they were issued, along with a statement that approval for the issue was obtained under Listing Rule 10.14. Any additional persons covered by Listing Rule 10.14 who become entitled to participate in the Plan after Resolution 4 is approved and who were not named in the Notice will not participate until approval is obtained under that rule; and
- (n) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

5.4 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

In accordance with Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act, in order to give a financial benefit to a related party, the Company must:

- (a) obtain Shareholder approval in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The grant of the Performance Rights constitutes giving a financial benefit and Ms Wellman is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director.

The Board (other than Ms Wellman who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) considers that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the issue of the Performance Rights because it is considered by the Board as reasonable remuneration and therefore falls within the exception stipulated by section 211 of the Corporations Act.

5.5 Board recommendation

Resolution 4 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board (other than Ms Wellman, who abstains from making a recommendation given her personal interest) recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4 for the reasons set out in Section 5.3(g).

6.1 General

The Company is in an important stage of development with significant opportunities and challenges in both the near and long-term, and the proposed issue of the Director Options seeks to align the efforts of the Directors in seeking to achieve growth of the Share price and in the creation of Shareholder value. In addition, the Board also believes that incentivising with Options is a prudent means of conserving the Company's available cash reserves. The Board believes it is important to offer these Director Options to continue to attract and maintain highly experienced and qualified Board members in a competitive market.

Resolution 5(a), (b) and (c) (inclusive) seeks Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 10.14 and sections 195(4) and 208 of the Corporations Act for the issue of up to 3,000,000 Director Options under the Plan to the Directors (or their respective nominee/s).

6.2 Listing Rule 10.14

A summary of Listing Rule 10.14 is in Section 5.2.

Approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Director Options as approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.14. Accordingly, the issue of the Director Options will not be included in the Company's 15% annual placement capacity in Listing Rule 7.1 or the maximum permitted number of Equity Securities issued under Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b).

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolution 5(a), (b) and (c) (inclusive) will be to allow the Company to proceed with the issue of the Director Options to the Directors (or their respective nominee/s) in the proportions listed above.

If Resolution 5(a), (b) and (c) (inclusive) are not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Director Options to the Directors (or their respective nominee/s) and the Company will consider other alternative commercial means to incentivise the Directors, including by the payment of cash, subject to the requirements of the Constitution, Corporations Act and Listing Rules.

Resolution 5(a), (b) and (c) (inclusive) are not conditional on each other, and Shareholders may approve one or all of those Resolutions (in which case, the Director Options the subject of the relevant Resolution(s) will be issued), even though Shareholders have not approved all of these Resolutions.

- (f) The Director Options will be issued on the terms and conditions set out in Annexure D.
- (g) The Board considers that Options, rather than Shares or cash, are an appropriate form of incentive because they seek to:
- (i) align the efforts of the Directors in seeking to achieve growth of the Share price and in the creation of Shareholder value;
 - (ii) reward the Directors for their continued service to the Company; and
 - (iii) conserve the Company's available cash reserves.
- (h) Using a Black & Scholes valuation model, the Company's valuation of the Director Options is in Annexure E, with a summary below.

- (m) Details of any securities issued under the Plan will be published in the annual report of the Company relating to the period in which they were issued, along with a statement that approval for the issue was obtained under Listing Rule 10.14.
- (n) Any additional persons covered by Listing Rule 10.14 who become entitled to participate in an issue of securities under the Plan after the resolution is approved and who were not named in the Notice will not participate until approval is obtained under Listing Rule 10.14.
- (o) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

6.4 Section 195 of the Corporations Act

Section 195(1) of the Corporations Act prohibits a director of a public company who has a material personal interest in a matter that is being considered at a meeting of directors from being present while the matter is being considered at the meeting or voting on the matter. If there is not a quorum of directors who are eligible to vote on a matter because of the operation of section 195(1) of the Corporations Act, one or more directors may call a general meeting and the general meeting may deal with the matter.

The Directors have a personal interest in the outcome of each of their respective Resolutions under Resolution 5(a), (b) and (c) (inclusive) and have exercised their right under section 195(4) of the Corporations Act to put the issue of the Director Options to Shareholders to resolve upon.

6.5 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

A summary of Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is in Section 5.4.

The proposed issue of the Director Options constitutes giving a financial benefit to related parties of the Company.

Given the personal interests of all the Directors in the outcome of this Resolution, the Board is seeking Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act in respect of the issue of the Director Options. The Board considers that there may be potential conflicts of interest should Shareholder approval not be sought.

The Shares to be issued upon conversion of the Director Options will be fully paid ordinary Shares in the capital of the Company on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares and will rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares. The Company will apply for official quotation of the Shares on ASX.

(c) **Board recommendations**

Given the personal interests of all the Directors in the outcome of this Resolution, the Board declines to make a recommendation to Shareholders in relation to Resolution 5(a), (b) and (c) (inclusive).

(d) **Valuation of financial benefit**

Ms Wellman (being the only Director without an interest in the outcome of Resolution 5(a) and (c) (inclusive)) notes that the grant of those Director Options to Messrs Mannolini and Dudfield is not contrary to the guidelines in Box 8.2 of the Recommendations on the basis that there are no performance hurdles attaching to the Director Options.

(j) **Taxation consequences**

There are no material taxation consequences for the Company arising from the issue of the Director Options (including fringe benefits tax).

(k) **Board recommendation**

The Board declines to make a recommendation to Shareholders given the personal interests of all the Directors in the outcome of this Resolution.

Spill Meeting has the meaning given to that term in Section 2.

Trading Day means a day determined by ASX to be a trading day in accordance with the Listing Rules.

ANNEXURE A – SUMMARY OF MATERIAL TERMS OF PLAN

A summary of the key terms of the Plan is set out below:

1. **(Eligible Participant):** A person is eligible to participate in the Plan (**Eligible Participant**) if they have been determined by the Board to be eligible to participate in the Plan from time to time and are an “ESS participant” (as that term is defined in Division 1A of the Corporations Act) in relation to the Company or an associated entity of the Company.

This relevantly includes, amongst others:

7. **(Terms of Convertible Securities):** Each 'Convertible Security' represents a right to acquire one or more Shares (for example, under an option or performance right), subject to the terms and conditions of the Plan.

Prior to a Convertible Security being exercised a Participant does not have any interest (legal, equitable or otherwise) in any Share the subject of the Convertible Security by virtue of holding the Convertible Security. A Participant may not sell, assign, transfer, grant a security interest over or otherwise deal with a Convertible Security that has been granted to them. A Participant must not enter into any arrangement for the purpose of hedging their economic exposure to a Convertible Security that has been granted to them.

8. **(Vesting of Convertible Securities):** Any vesting conditions applicable to the grant of Convertible Securities will be described in the invitation. If all the vesting conditions are satisfied and/or otherwise waived by the Board, a vesting notice will be sent to the Participant by the Company informing them that the relevant Convertible Securities have vested.
