HITIQ Selected by Leading US Military Research Centre, Appoints Strategic Military Advisor

Key Highlights

- HITIQ signs Letter of Intent with the University of Southern Mississippi Sport and Tactical Athlete Research Lab (USM STAR) and the University of Mississippi National Center for Tactical Readiness (UM NCTR).
- Initial collaboration focused on measuring head impact exposure and head-neck kinematics in military and tactical training environments using PROTEQT D-MAX and PROTEQT iMG technologies.
- Collaboration intended to support broader Defence research activities, including firearms training and special operations environments, with parties intending to explore potential future CRADAs; the Letter of Intent is non-binding, with specific study scopes, funding, data and publication rights subject to separate formal agreements.
- Aaron Bell, formerly a full-time Lieutenant Colonel in the Australian Army with more than 25 years' experience in aviation engineering, strategic planning and Defence technology commercialisation, appointed Strategic Military Advisor.
- Mr Bell previously served as Chief Engineer for the Australian Army's Black Hawk, Kiowa and Chinook helicopter fleets and as Chief of Plans (J5) for Joint Task Force 633.
- In his advisory role, Mr Bell will support HITIQ's Defence engagement, capability development and procurement strategies, including engineering-level guidance on ruggedisation for military deployment environments.

Preferred US Defence Research Collaboration

HITIQ Limited (HITIQ or the Company) (ASX: HIQ) is pleased to announce the execution of a Letter of Intent with the University of Southern Mississippi Sport and Tactical Athlete Research Lab (USM STAR) and the University of Mississippi National Center for Tactical Readiness (UM NCTR), alongside the appointment of Aaron Bell, formerly a full-time Lieutenant Colonel in the Australian Army, as Strategic Military Advisor.

The Letter of Intent establishes a framework for collaboration between HITIQ, USM STAR and UM NCTR, with an initial focus on measuring head impact exposure and head-neck kinematics in military and tactical training environments using HITIQ's PROTEQT D-MAX and PROTEQT iMG technologies.

USM STAR is a laboratory with more than a decade of Congressionally funded research focused on improving warfighter safety and performance. UM NCTR is a Congressionally funded centre dedicated to advancing the health, performance and readiness of military, first responder and tactical personnel.

The collaboration is intended to support broader Defence research activities, including studies involving firearms training and special operations environments. The parties also intend to explore potential future Cooperative Research and Development Agreements (CRADAs) with US military stakeholders, subject to relevant approvals and future formal agreements.

The Letter of Intent is non-binding and establishes a framework for collaboration between the parties. Specific study scopes, funding arrangements, data rights, publication rights and any future CRADAs remain subject to separate formal agreements.

Strategic Military Appointment

Alongside the research collaboration, HITIQ has appointed Aaron Bell as Strategic Military Advisor. He is an aeronautical engineer, technology executive and former full-time Australian Army officer with more than 25 years' experience across military operations, aviation engineering, strategic planning and technology commercialisation.

Mr Bell served as Chief Engineer for the Australian Army's Black Hawk, Kiowa and Chinook helicopter fleets and later served as Chief of Plans (J5) for Joint Task Force 633, supporting Australia's operations in Iraq, Afghanistan and the broader Middle East.

Mr Bell is a recipient of the Australian Defence Force Gold Commendation and the United States Meritorious Service Medal.

In his advisory role, Mr Bell will support HITIQ's Defence engagement, capability development and procurement strategies across key Defence markets. He will also provide engineering-level guidance relating to data optimisation, systems integration and ruggedisation considerations relevant to military deployment environments.

Strengthening HITIQ's Defence Commercialisation Strategy

Together, the US Defence research collaboration and Aaron Bell appointment strengthen HITIQ's Defence commercialisation strategy and support the Company's objective of establishing PROTEQT D-MAX as a Defence-specific solution for monitoring head impact exposure and blast-related events within military and tactical training environments.

The Company believes these initiatives further position HITIQ to engage Defence stakeholders, support technology evaluation activities and progress long-term Defence opportunities for PROTEQT D-MAX.
