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Industrial land purchased for Collie plant development

International Graphite Limited (ASX: IG6) (FWB: H99) has settled on the purchase of the land for Australia's first commercial graphite micronising facility at Collie, in Western Australia.

The Company has settled on the purchase of three lots in the Collie Light Industrial Area (LIA)² from the Western Australian Government's central development agency DevelopmentWA.

The 6,000 square metre land parcel is immediately opposite the Company's existing R&D facility – home to Australia's first pilot graphite micronising plant.

The Company is working with designers to finalise the detailed facility design in preparation for major plant and equipment items which have been ordered. Essential power supply has been approved by Western Power and a development application is currently in the final stages with the Shire of Collie. Approval will pave the way for construction to commence on the new site.

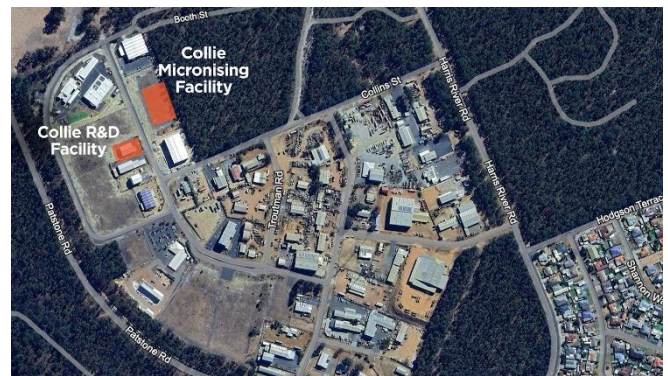


Figure 1 (top left): R&D Facility. Figure 2 (top right): Plant locations. Figure 3: New lots in the Collie LIA.

Managing Director and CEO Andrew Worland said International Graphite was one of the first businesses to move into the new industrial precinct which has been developed by the Western Australian Government to attract new industry and support economic diversification and growth in the region.

“The Collie Micronising Facility is coming online at a pivotal moment for global graphite supply. Interest from manufacturers has been strong, with many seeking reliable alternatives to tenuous overseas supply. Several companies are now assessing our products,” Mr Worland said.

“The State Government has taken a very strategic position and has played a key role in the progress we have made to date. Premium land in WA’s south-west is becoming scarce. In developing this site we expect to generate value well above the capital invested.”

Over the past three years, the Western Australian Government has provided a \$12.5 million package of grants to progress development of the Company’s Collie and Springdale projects.

Collie is recognised as a WA Super Town, a town identified by the WA Government for major future growth, and a significant base for industrial activity. Recent developments in the area include the establishment of a pilot magnesium production plant, a leading edge water filtration media plant and plans for Australia’s latest low emissions steel mill.
