Quarterly Activities Report – April - June 2025

NeuRizer Ltd ("NeuRizer" or the "Company") submits the following Activities Report and Quarterly Cash Flow Statement (refer to attached Appendix 5B) for the quarter ending 30 June 2025.

Change in Director and Company Secretary

On 20 May 2025, Ms Jordan Mehrtens resigned as a Non-Executive Director and Company Secretary of the Company. Mr Justyn Peters, NRZ Executive Chairman, will assume the role of Company Secretary.

India

NeuRizer was progressing discussions with several organisations focused on developing commercial In Situ Gasification projects in India. Those discussions were reduced to one party culminating in a non-binding term sheet and two letters of award (see ASX announcement on the 13th of March 2026 for details) for the purchase of a licensing agreement and a sales of redundant plant and equipment at Leigh Creek

Suspension in trading shares

The company's shares were suspended from trading under the Australian Securities Exchange (ASX) Listing Rule 17.5. NeuRizer continues to work with its Auditor and the ASX to resolve the issues giving rise to the suspension, and the company is working through each of the ASX requirements for the suspension to be lifted.

NeuRizer Urea Project (NRUP) Stage 1 Update

Stage 1 of the NRUP builds on the successful Pre-Commercial Demonstration that NeuRizer operated in 2018 and 2019. The overarching purpose of Stage 1 is to further demonstrate the commercial, technical, environmental and financial credentials of the NRUP.

NeuRizer is progressing the Stage 1 EIS. This brings the NRUP closer to project start-up and represents progress towards final project approval and first urea production (i.e. Stage 2).

Stage 1 of the NRUP remains a declared Major Project for South Australia, positioning NeuRizer as a future leader in domestic and international urea production. Upon production, the project aims to deliver significant economic benefits but also contribute to sustainable agricultural solutions on a global scale by strengthening supply chain certainty to Australian farmers for a key agricultural input, urea fertiliser.



Continuation of work at Leigh Creek

Work undertaken during this quarter at site included :

- groundwater monitoring on site as per DEM (South Australian Department of Energy and Mining) approved Groundwater Monitoring Plan.
- Air quality monitoring at site.
- Air quality North and South of Site.
- Surface water monitoring at site.
- Measuring for ground subsidence around the generator.
- Reviewing final EIS guidelines for NRUP Stage 1.
- Conducted a gap analysis to determine what additional information is required to fulfill the requirements for the NRUP Stage 1 DEM EIS.
- Compiled and continued work on the EIS for NRUP Stage 1 as per the EIS guidelines supplied by the federal government DCCEEW Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water) under the EPBC Act..
- Ongoing maintenance and repairs to all site infrastructure, plant and equipment. This includes service and repairs to site generators, telehandler, vehicles, pumps, buildings, etc. *This activity will continue into 2026*
- Ongoing road maintenance to dirt roads, used by Neurizer, on the Leigh Creek PEL 650.
- Continued Maintenance, repaired safety fencing and signage around the PCD.
- Ongoing maintenance and repairs of company owned houses and units in Leigh Creek
- Regular liaison with local community in Leigh Creek.
- Attending community events (Leigh Creek, Copley and surrounding areas) and providing representation on local community associations.
- Working alongside the Dept of Energy & Mining (Minerals division) to plan and implement a new water supply pipeline to the Leigh Creek and Department site infrastructure.
- Maintaining compliance in all aspects of health and safety. All checks are recorded in Neurizer's health & safety online system lodged with South Australian Department of Energy and Mining.
- Conducted regular site security checks of the petroleum license to check security gates, fences and pipelines and on several occasions removed intruders.
- Ongoing site inspections, reporting and documenting as per Neurizer's site processes. All inspections and documents are entered electronically into Neurizer's health and safety online system for the South Australian Department of Energy and Mining. *This activity will continue into 2026*



Finance and Corporate

The accompanying Appendix 5B (Quarterly Cashflow Report) includes a summary of cash inflows and outflows for the quarter, including amounts in item 6.1, which include executive and non-executive director fees paid as salaries and wages.

During the quarter, the Company incurred \$112k on exploration and evaluation activities, with the majority relating to capitalised labour costs, site maintenance, and other minor operating costs.
