Ronin Resources Limited (ASX: RON) is an ASX listed company focused on the evaluation and assessment of the Vetas, and the La Punilla Projects located in Colombia and Argentina respectively. Both projects are 100% owned by Ronin. The Company also seeks to evaluate and assess complementary new business opportunities capable of delivering shareholder returns.

June 2026 Quarterly Activities Report and Appendix 5B

- Continued exploration work at the Company's 100% owned La Punilla gold-silver project located in San Juan, Argentina.
- Rock chip sampling and extensive mapping conducted by geologists and field assistants.
- Drone-based high-resolution aeromagnetic survey completed, with results indicating a magnetic source below the main area of interest, the Quebrada Palca colour anomaly.
- Follow-up field campaign has commenced to extend sampling at remaining targets and ground-truth recently identified magnetic anomalies.
- The Company remains actively engaged in the evaluation and assessment of complementary acquisition opportunities.
- Cash reserves of \$2.754m as at 30 June 2026.

Ronin Resources Ltd (**ASX: RON**) (**Ronin** or the **Company**) provides the following report and attached Appendix 5B to its shareholders for the quarter ended 30 June 2026.

The Company's primary activities during the quarter were to advance exploration at its 100% owned La Punilla gold-silver project located in the San Juan region in Argentina, and continue to identify and assess value accretive acquisition opportunities.

La Punilla gold-silver project, San Juan, Argentina

Geological mapping and rock-chip sampling continued during the quarter focused on detailed follow-up mapping and sampling of the Quebrada Palca colour anomaly and initial sampling of several anomalies that have been identified by Sentinel 2 satellite data (Figure 2) and ground-truthing the magnetic anomaly.

Drone-Based Aeromagnetic Survey

A drone-based aeromagnetic survey was completed by local Argentinian geological contractor, DAMS Geophysics, to investigate whether a magnetic source underlies the surface alteration and to map its geometry at depth.

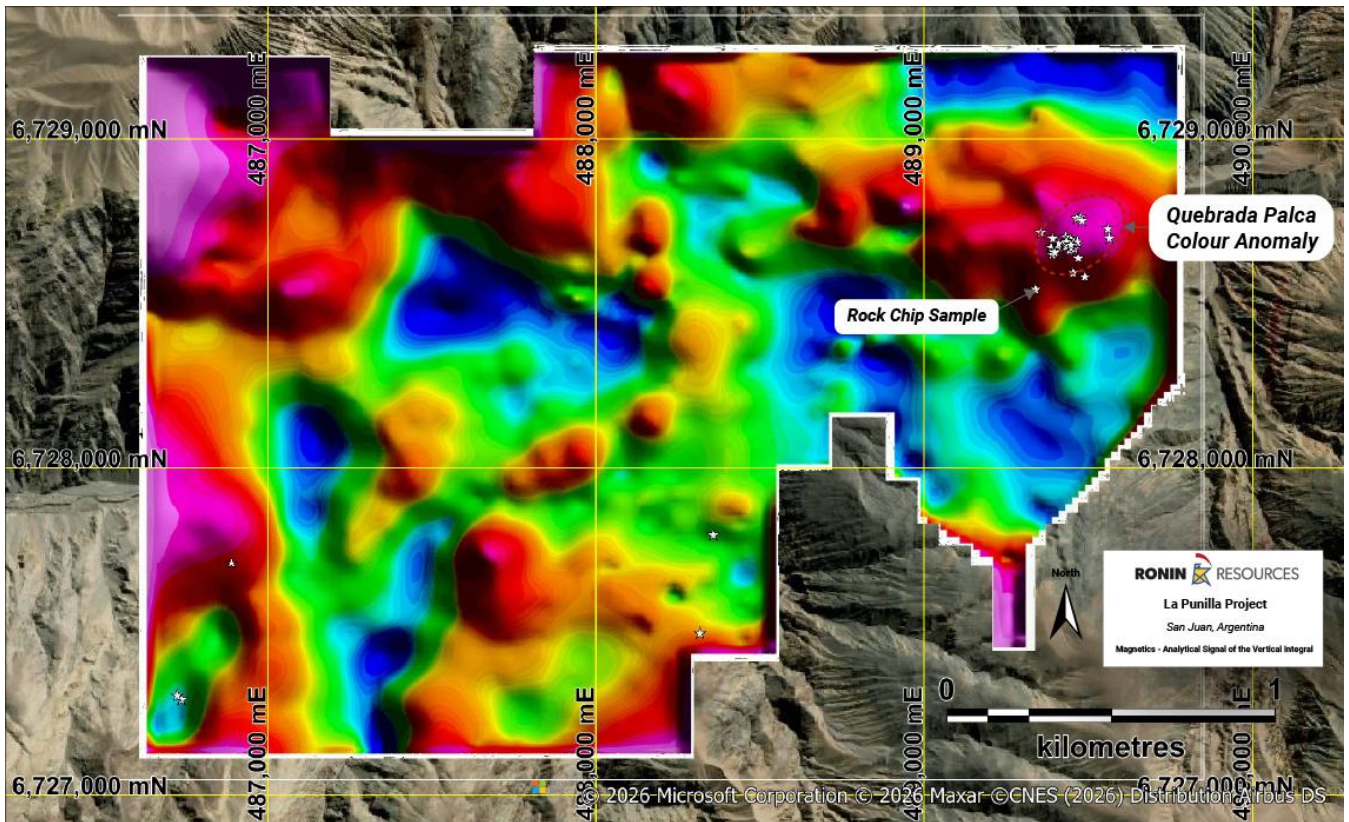


Figure 1: Results of the aeromagnetic survey. Processing shown is the analytical signal of the vertical integral. This processing removes regional gradients and allows the correct spatial positioning of magnetic sources. Here it is overlain semi-transparently on a high-resolution satellite image. Stars indicate rock-chip geochemical sample locations. The cluster in the eastern part of the grid represents the location of the samples taken over the Quebrada Palca colour anomaly.

Survey results, received and reported during the quarter (refer ASX announcement 4 May 2026), indicate a magnetic source directly below the Quebrada Palca colour anomaly (Figure 1). Dimensions of the surveyed part of the anomaly are about 1km x 500m. The anomaly appears to weaken at its eastern extremity, but was not closed off. These dimensions are within the size-range of the magnetite bearing parts of the potassic alteration zone in porphyry copper deposits.

Geochemical results from samples over the Quebrada Palca colour anomaly

As reported in the Company's 4 May 2026 ASX announcement, gold values from the quartz veinlets zone were up to 3.04 g/t in the new sampling and copper up to 1,055 ppm (Figure 3). Copper and gold anomalous samples are mainly concentrated in an east-northeast trending belt. This trend coincides with the long axis of the magnetic anomaly. Anomalous molybdenum and tungsten were also found (W shown in Figure 3). A sample in which wolframite had been identified in the field had 2,110 ppm tungsten indicating a granitoid intrusive affinity. Silver values were also elevated, with a maximum of 13.75 g/t (Figure 3).

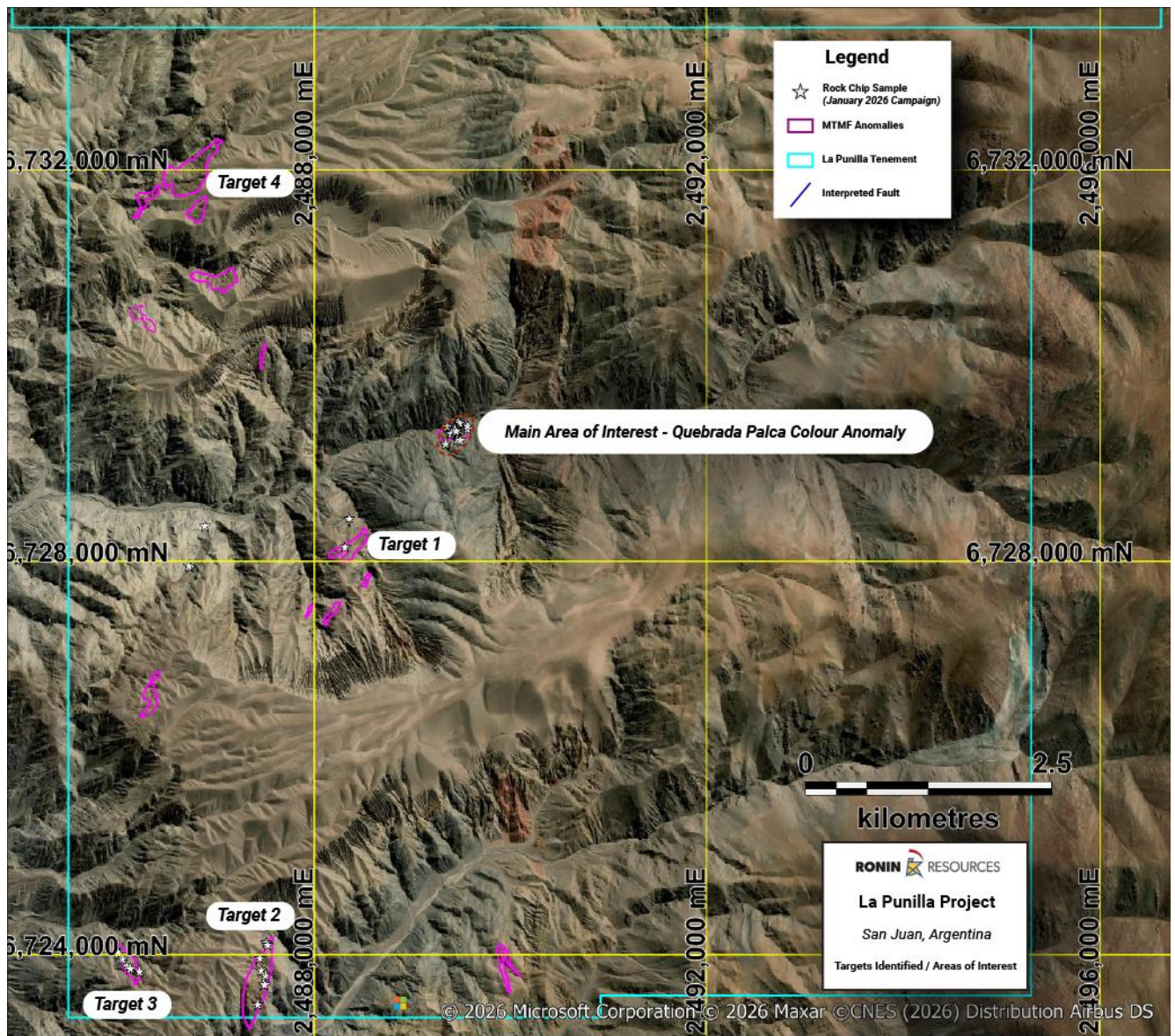


Figure 2: La Punilla Project – Main Area of Interest (Quebrada Palca Colour Anomaly) showing targets identified, MTMF anomalies and all rock chip samples from the January 2026 campaign. Map indicates the new work which was undertaken in January 2026; new sample locations are shown with star symbols, MTMF anomalies by magenta-coloured polygons, and purple lines represent interpreted faults.

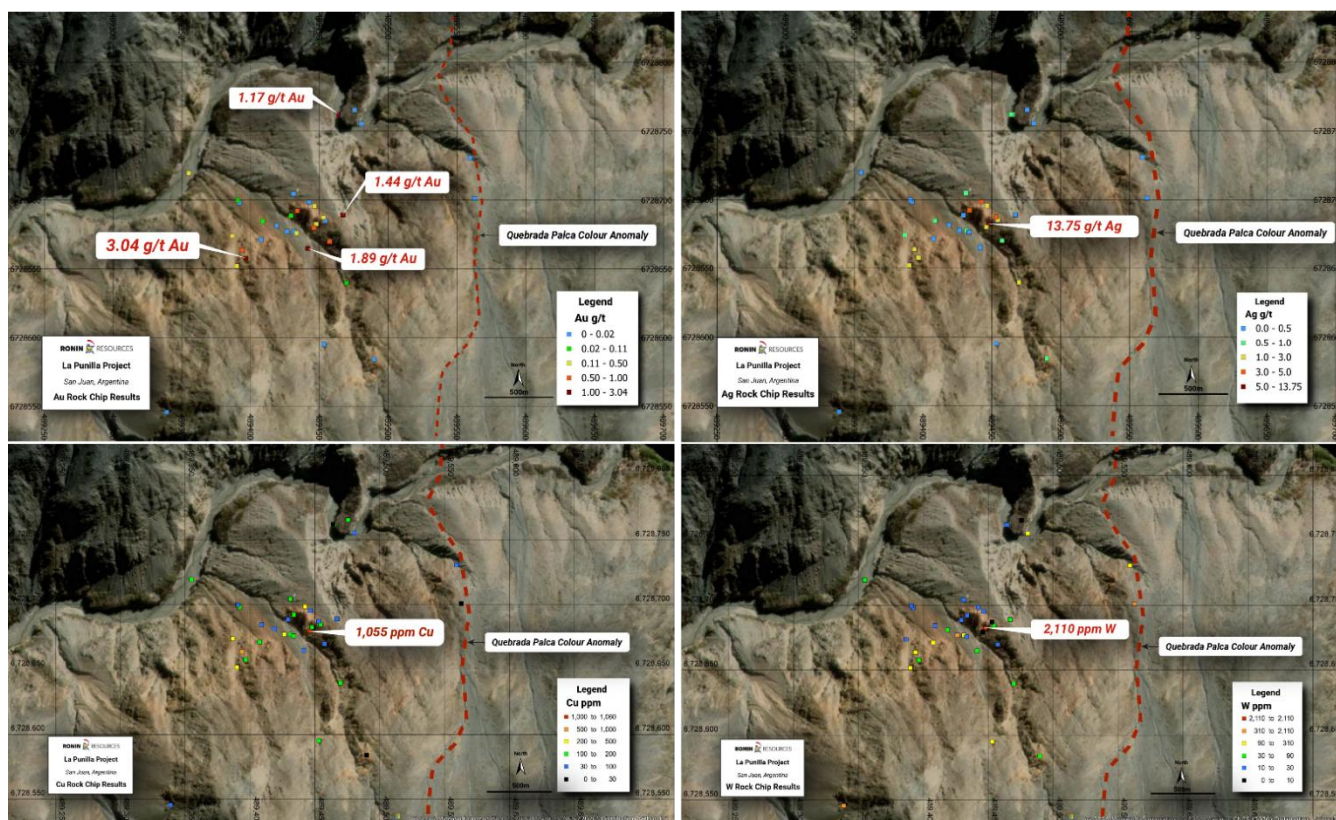


Figure 3: Quebrada Palca rock-chip geochemistry — Au (top left), Ag (top right), Cu (bottom left), W (bottom right). Combined results from the November 2025 (refer ASX announcement, 27 January 2026) and January 2026 field campaigns. Peak values labelled. WGS84 Zone 19S.

Results from other areas

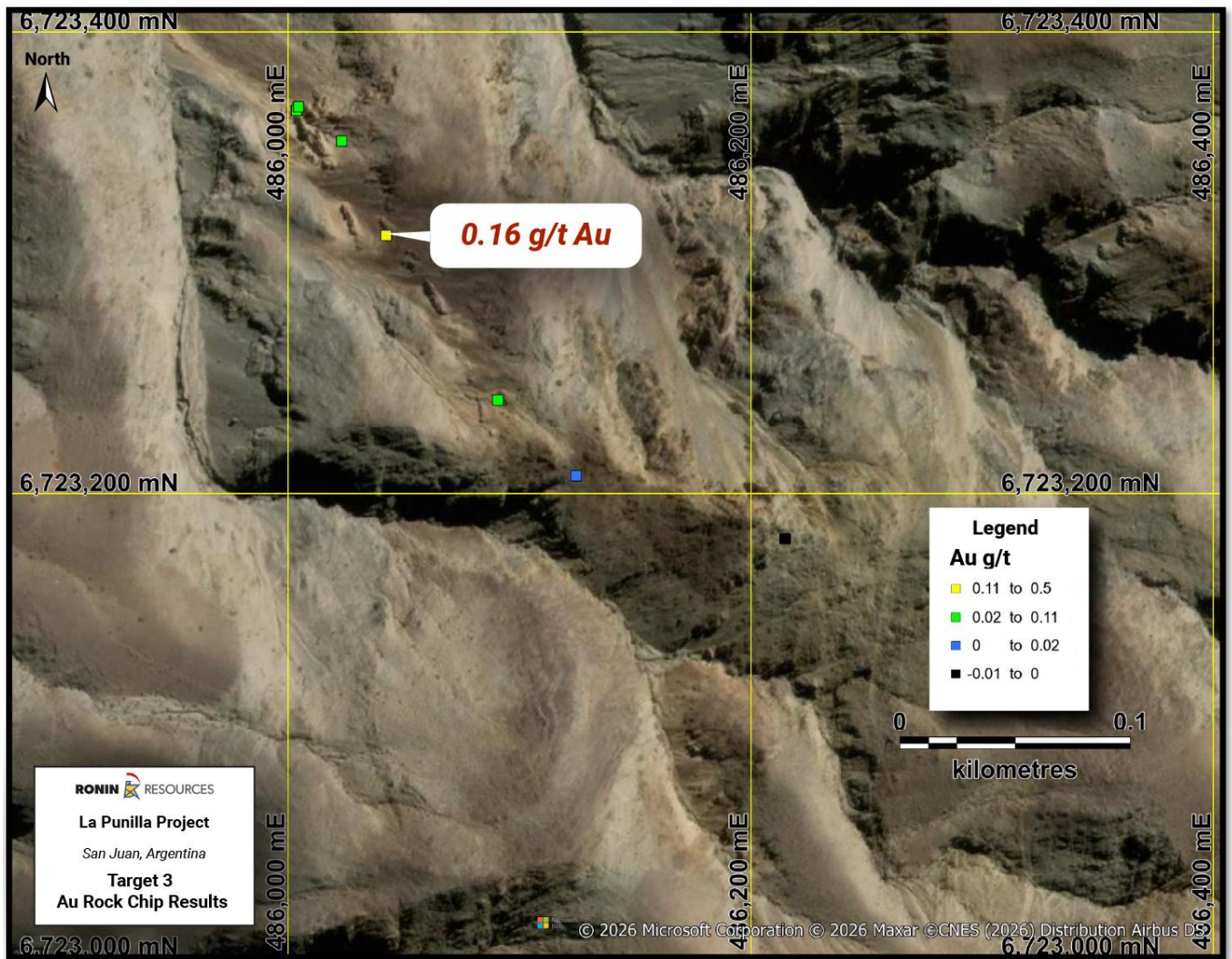


Figure 4: Thematic map of gold results from Target 3 (in g/t). The yellow point indicates the position of a sample that had 0.16 g/t Au. Note that the reddish toned rocks that host the anomalous gold extend south-east beyond the area sampled.

Encouraging gold anomalies were returned from Target 3, located approximately 6 km WSW of the Quebrada Palca colour anomaly (Figure 4). The highest value from the samples taken was 0.16 g/t Au. The association of anomalous gold from this preliminary sampling with ammonium illite (refer ASX announcement 27 January 2026) indicates that the mineralising process is not restricted to the Quebrada Palca colour anomaly and that there is scope to identify additional occurrences elsewhere within the property package. MTMF-processed Sentinel 2 imagery has performed well at Target 3 and will assist in focusing field efforts on the most prospective parts of the property package.

Future work planned

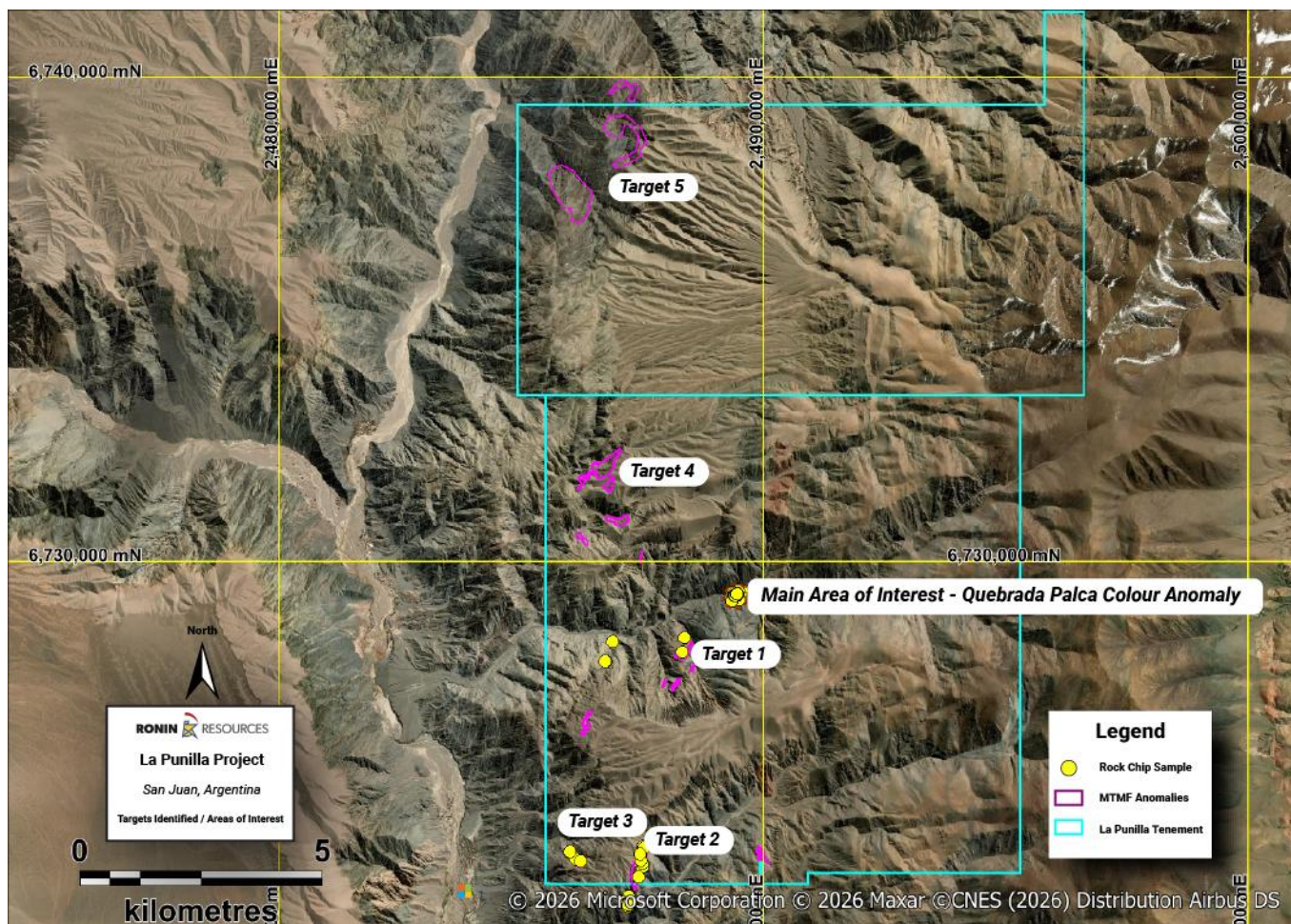


Figure 5: La Punilla Project – All targets identified and areas of interest, including MTMF anomalies and all rock chip sampling locations to date.

A follow-up field campaign was completed that prioritized sampling the remaining anomalies, particularly Target 4 and Target 5 (the latter on an adjacent property to the north, see Figure 5), more detailed sampling of Target 3, and revisiting Target 1 and selected magnetic anomalies identified by the recent aeromagnetic survey.

Other Projects

No exploration activities were undertaken at the Vetás Project in Colombia during the quarter.

No mining production or development activities were undertaken during the quarter.

Acquisition Opportunities

As noted in the Company's 19 February 2026 ASX announcement, Ronin was in early-stage discussions with respect to acquiring an interest in an early-stage copper-gold project located in Argentina. Commercial terms between the parties could not be agreed, and discussions between the parties ceased. The Company remains actively involved in seeking and assessing complementary and value accretive acquisition opportunities and will update the market in accordance with its continuous disclosure obligations.

Appendix 5B related party payments

During the June 2026 quarter the Company spent \$74,000 on geological exploration consulting services.
