Streamplay Studio Quarterly Update and Appendix 4C

Streamplay Studio Limited (“**Streamplay**” or the “**Company**”) (ASX: SP8) is pleased to provide its quarterly report for the period ended 31 March 2026 (the “**Quarter**”), highlighting continued operational execution across the Group’s publishing and platform businesses, supported by continued receipts and stable recurring platform revenues.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Cash receipts of ~A\$2.54 million, reflecting continued contribution from global publishing activity alongside stable recurring platform revenues.
- Fourth consecutive quarter of positive operating cash flows with a ~\$2.22 million positive result for the financial year to date (9 months).
- Publishing revenues supported by post-launch performance of key titles, with continued contribution driven by platform promotions, sales events and long-tail monetisation dynamics.
- Progression of forward publishing pipeline, with multiple titles advancing toward release and ongoing engagement with Tier-1 global platform partners.
- Advancement of platform expansion initiatives, including completion of key partner integrations in Fiji and Palau, positioning new markets for near-term launch.
- Continued investment across intellectual property and platform expansion, supporting the Group’s next phase of growth.
- Closing cash balance of ~A\$6.25 million, reflecting ~A\$1.8 million in Noodlecake acquisition payments, with no material debt.

Summary

The Quarter represents a period of continued execution for Streamplay, with receipts normalising following the December quarter’s major release cycle while remaining above historical levels across the Group’s publishing portfolio. Cash receipts totalled approximately A\$2.54 million, supported by ongoing contributions from Noodlecake’s publishing operations and recurring platform revenues across the Middle East, Africa and Pacific regions.



During the Quarter, the Company continued to invest in its growth strategy, including payments relating to prior acquisitions and ongoing development and intellectual property initiatives. Operationally, the Group progressed a number of new market integrations and platform expansion initiatives, alongside continued engagement with Tier-1 partners across its publishing division.

Noodlecake's attendance at the Game Developers Conference (GDC) supported further advancement of its publishing pipeline, with multiple new opportunities and platform partnerships under evaluation.

Noodlecake - Tier 1 Publishing & Game Portfolio

The Quarter represented a period of continued execution for Noodlecake, following a strong December quarter driven by major title launches and platform activity. Notable updates include:

- **Publishing Portfolio Performance** – Performance during the Quarter normalised while remaining above historical levels, supported by continued contribution from key titles including *Winter Burrow* and ongoing platform partnerships. Performance was underpinned by storefront promotions, platform visibility, seasonal sales events and continued player engagement.
- **[Amazon Luna GameNight](#)** – Noodlecake continues to progress its publishing relationship with Amazon following the successful day-one launch of *Flappy Golf Party* and *Ultimate Chicken Horse* on Luna GameNight (ASX: 27 October 2025). The Quarter reflected ongoing delivery under existing commercial agreements, with licence-based revenue and continued evaluation of additional opportunities aligned to partner requirements.
- **[Winter Burrow](#)** – Following its successful global launch in the December quarter (ASX: 2 December 2025), *Winter Burrow* continued to contribute to the Group's publishing revenues across PC and console platforms. Post-launch performance has been supported by ongoing platform promotions, sales events and content updates, consistent with a long-tail monetisation profile.
- **Publishing Pipeline** – The Company continued to strengthen its forward publishing slate through the progression of previously announced titles, including *Golden Lap* (ASX: 3 November 2025) and *Yes, Your Grace: Snowfall* (ASX: 12 January 2026), both of which remain on track for release in FY26.

Noodlecake continues to assess additional publishing and co-development opportunities at various stages of evaluation, alongside active engagement with Tier-1 global platform partners, aligned with the Company's premium mobile, PC and console strategy.

Platform & Emerging Markets Operations

Streamplay’s platform and telco-aligned operations across the Pacific and Middle East & Africa continued to generate recurring subscription receipts during the Quarter, supporting the Group’s diversified recurring revenue base.

Activity during the period was characterised by continued optimisation across existing markets and targeted growth initiatives in selected territories, with a focus on improving user acquisition efficiency, engagement and monetisation outcomes across the portfolio, with revenue performance showing a notable increase on the prior quarter across the portfolio.

A key focus for the Quarter was the advancement of the Company’s geographic expansion strategy. Streamplay progressed a number of commercial and technical workstreams supporting entry into new markets across both emerging and developed regions, including North America, across its ArcadeX and cloud gaming product suite, with multiple launches approaching execution, subject to final partner approvals and integration milestones.

This included the completion of key partner integration activities in Fiji and Palau during the Quarter, marking the final stages of a multi-year rollout process and positioning these markets for launch and initial revenue contribution, with product rollouts expected to commence in the near term, subject to partner timing and market conditions.

These expansion initiatives reflect increasing engagement with both existing and new partners across the Group’s platform network and are expected to support incremental revenue growth as new markets are brought online over the coming periods.

Initial contributions from new markets are expected to be modest, with revenue performance scaling over time, dependent on subscriber uptake and partner-led marketing activity following launch.



Financial Summary

The Group recorded net positive operating cash inflow of A\$35k for the Quarter (Q2 FY26: ~A\$2.06 million inflow), reflecting a normalisation in cash receipts following the prior quarter's major release activity and typical post-December receipt patterns. For the year to date (9 months), the Group recorded a strong net positive operating cash inflow of A\$2.22 million.

Cash receipts totalled approximately A\$2.54 million for the Quarter (Q2 FY26: ~A\$3.86 million), reflecting continued contributions from global publishing activity augmented by stable recurring platform revenues.

Operating outflows comprised approximately A\$1.73 million in research and development, A\$0.29 million in staff costs, A\$0.35 million in product and operating costs, and A\$0.13 million in corporate and administrative expenses, remaining broadly consistent with prior quarters.

Total payments to related parties and their associates for the Quarter were A\$75k, covering standard executive and board-related fees made on arm's-length commercial terms.

During the Quarter, the Company made the penultimate payment to the vendors of Noodlecake of ~\$1.8 million, in line with the terms of the Noodlecake acquisition (ASX: 23 December 2024).

The Company closed the Quarter with cash and cash equivalents of approximately A\$6.25 million (31 December 2025: ~A\$8.55 million) and no debt.

The integration of Noodlecake has significantly strengthened our publishing capability, with its contribution continuing to support group receipts and validate our strategy of building a diversified, Tier-1 content portfolio.

While the March quarter included a higher level of investment activity, particularly across intellectual property and platform expansion, this reflects a deliberate focus on reinvesting into the Group's publishing pipeline and platform expansion to support its next phase of growth.

With multiple titles progressing toward release and new markets approaching launch, we are entering the next quarter with strong underlying momentum across both publishing and platform operations.

Outlook

The Company enters FY26 Q4 with a strong pipeline of publishing releases and continued momentum across its platform operations.

Noodlecake is progressing a number of upcoming titles across mobile, PC and console, alongside active engagement with Tier-1 global platform partners, supporting multiple near-term opportunities for new content launches and platform distribution agreements.

Across its platform business, the Company is focused on the execution of its geographic expansion strategy, with a number of new market launches expected in the near term. These initiatives are anticipated to broaden the Group's recurring revenue base as additional markets are brought online.

Streamplay remains focused on disciplined capital allocation, continuing to invest in content, intellectual property and platform expansion initiatives whilst exploring acquisition opportunities and maintaining a strong balance sheet to support the execution of its growth strategy.
