The Directors have determined pursuant to regulation 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered as Shareholders on Monday, 17 November 2025 at 2:00pm (AWST).

Terms and abbreviations used in this Notice and the Explanatory Memorandum are defined in Schedule 1.

To consider the Annual Report of the Company and its controlled entities for the financial year ended 30 June 2025, which includes the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report.

1 Resolution 1 – Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as a non-binding resolution, the following:

"That, pursuant to and in accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the adoption of the Remuneration Report on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Voting Prohibition

In accordance with section 250R of the Corporations Act, a vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by, or on behalf of:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel whose remuneration details are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person described above may cast a vote on this Resolution if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described in subparagraphs (a) or (b) above and either:

- (a) the person does so as a proxy appointed in writing that specifies how the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or

3 Resolution 3 – Re-election of a Director – Mr Ian Middlemas

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution, the following:

"That, pursuant to and in accordance with Article 7.3(c) and for all other purposes, Mr Ian Middlemas, a Director, retires and being eligible pursuant to Article 7.3(f), is re-elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

4 Resolution 4 – Ratify the issue of Placement Shares under Listing Rule 7.1

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

1 Introduction

This Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared for the information of Shareholders in connection with the business to be conducted at the Meeting to be held at the Conference Room, Ground Floor, 28 The Esplanade, Perth, Western Australia on Wednesday, 19 November 2025 commencing at 2:00pm (AWST).

This Explanatory Memorandum forms part of the Notice which should be read in its entirety. This Explanatory Memorandum contains the terms and conditions on which the Resolutions will be voted.

This Explanatory Memorandum includes the following information to assist Shareholders in deciding how to vote on the Resolutions:

2 Action to be taken by Shareholders

Shareholders should read the Notice (including this Explanatory Memorandum) carefully before deciding how to vote on the Resolutions.

2.1 Proxies

A Proxy Form is enclosed with the Notice. This is to be used by Shareholders if they wish to appoint a representative (a 'proxy') to vote in their place. All Shareholders are invited and encouraged to attend the Meeting or, if they are unable to attend in person, sign and return the Proxy Form to the Company in accordance with the instructions set out in the Proxy Form. Returning the Proxy Form to the Company will not preclude a Shareholder from attending or (subject to the voting exclusions set out in the Notice) voting at the Meeting in person.

Please note that:

- (a) a Shareholder entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy;
- (b) a proxy need not be a Shareholder; and
- (c) a Shareholder entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. Where the proportion or number is not specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes.

Proxy Forms must be received by the Company no later than 2:00pm (AWST) on Monday, 17 November 2025, being at least 48 hours before the Meeting.

The Proxy Form provides further details on appointing proxies and lodging Proxy Forms.

2.2 Form of Instruction

Holders of Depositary Interests should complete and sign a Form of Instruction sent to Depositary Interest holders and return it by the time and in accordance with the instructions set out in the Form of Instruction. Holders of Depositary Interests will not be eligible to vote in person at the Meeting.

3 Annual Report

In accordance with section 317(1) of the Corporations Act, the Annual Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2025 must be laid before the Meeting. There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report.

At the Meeting, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to:

- (a) discuss the Annual Report which is available online at www.sovereignmetals.com.au;
- (b) ask questions about, or comment on, the management of the Company; and
- (c) ask the Auditor questions about the conduct of the audit and the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report.

In addition to taking questions at the Meeting, written questions to the Chairperson about the management of the Company, or to the Auditor about:

- (a) the preparation and contents of the Auditor's Report;
- (b) the conduct of the audit;
- (c) accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- (d) the independence of the Auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit,

may be submitted no later than 5 business days before the Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's registered office.

4 Resolution 1 – Remuneration Report

In accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Company must put the Remuneration Report to the vote of Shareholders. The Directors' Report contains the Remuneration Report which sets out:

- (a) the Company's remuneration policy; and
- (b) the remuneration arrangements in place for the executive Directors, specified executives and non-executive Directors.

In accordance with section 250R(3) of the Corporations Act, Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors. If Resolution 1 is not passed, the Directors will not be required to alter any of the arrangements in the Remuneration Report.

Pursuant to the Corporations Act, Shareholders will have the opportunity to remove the whole Board except the Managing Director if the Remuneration Report receives a 'no' vote of 25% or more (**Strike**) at two consecutive AGM's.

If the Resolution on the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at two consecutive AGM's, the Company will be required to put to Shareholders at the second AGM, a Resolution on whether another meeting should be held (within 90 days) at which all Directors (other than the Managing Director) who were in office at the date of approval of the applicable Directors' Report must stand for re-election.

The Company's Remuneration Report did not receive a Strike at the Company's 2024 AGM. If the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at the Meeting, Shareholders should be aware that if a second Strike is received at the Company's 2026 AGM, this may result in the re-election of the Board.

The Chairperson will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders as a whole to ask about, or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

Resolution 1 is a non-binding Resolution.

The Chairperson intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 1.

If the Chairperson is appointed as your proxy and you have not specified the way the Chairperson is to vote on Resolution 1, by signing and returning the Proxy Form, you are considered to have provided the Chairperson with an express authorisation for the Chairperson to vote the proxy in accordance with the Chairperson's intention, even though the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

5 Resolution 2 – Re-election of Director - Mr Benjamin Stoikovich

5.1 General

Article 7.3(c) requires that one third of the Directors must retire at each AGM (rounded down to the nearest whole number), excluding any Director that was appointed by the Directors under Article 7.2(a) and is required to retire under Article 7.3(i).

In addition, Article 7.3(b) provides that a Director must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the Director's appointment or three years, whichever is longer.

Article 7.3(f) provides that a Director who retires under Articles 7.3(b) or 7.3(c) is eligible for re-election.

Mr Stoikovich was previously re-elected by Shareholders at the Company's annual general meeting held on 18 November 2022.

Resolution 2 provides that Mr Stoikovich retires by rotation and seeks re-election as a Director.

Details of Mr Stoikovich's qualifications and experience are set out in the Annual Report.

Resolution 2 is an ordinary resolution.

The Chairperson intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 2.

5.2 Board Recommendation

The Board (excluding Mr Stoikovich) supports the re-election of Mr Stoikovich as a Director and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

6 Resolution 3 – Re-election of Director - Mr Ian Middlemas

6.1 General

Article 7.3(c) requires that one third of the Directors must retire at each AGM (rounded down to the nearest whole number), excluding any Director that was appointed by the Directors under Article 7.2(a) and is required to retire under Article 7.3(i).

Article 7.3(e) requires that the Directors to retire under Article 7.3(c) shall be those who have held their office as Director the longest period of time since their last appointment to that office and if two or more Directors have held office for the same period of time since their last appointment, those Directors determined by the drawing of lots, unless those Directors agree otherwise.

Article 7.3(f) provides that a Director who retires under Articles 7.3(b) or 7.3(c) is eligible for re-election.

Mr Middlemas was previously re-elected by Shareholders at the Company's annual general meeting held on 24 November 2023.

Resolution 3 provides that Mr Middlemas retires by rotation and seeks re-election as a Director.

Details of Mr Middlemas' qualifications and experience are set out in the Annual Report.

Resolution 3 is an ordinary resolution.

The Chairperson intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 3.

6.2 Board Recommendation

The Board (excluding Mr Middlemas) supports the re-election of Mr Middlemas as a Director and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

7 Resolution 4 – Ratify the issue of Placement Shares under Listing Rule 7.1

7.1 General

On 26 March 2025, the Company completed a placement of 47,058,824 new fully paid ordinary shares at an issue price of A\$0.85 per share (**Placement Shares**) to raise gross proceeds of A\$40,000,000 before costs (**Placement**).

The Placement was strongly supported by new and existing Shareholders, including large global institutional investors. The Placement Shares were issued pursuant to the Company's 15% Placement Capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 (and for all other purposes) to ratify the issue of the 47,058,824 Shares issued pursuant to the Company's 15% Placement Capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

Resolution 4 is an ordinary resolution.

The Chairperson intends to exercise all available undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 4.

7.2 Listing Rules 7.1 & 7.4

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period (**15% Placement Capacity**).

Listing Rule 7.4 provides that if the Company in a general meeting ratifies the previous issue of Equity Securities made pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach Listing Rule 7.1), those Equity Securities will be deemed to have been made with Shareholder approval for the purpose of Listing Rule 7.1.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional Equity Securities in the future up to the 15% Placement Capacity set out in Listing Rule 7.1 without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 4 is passed, the 47,058,824 Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% Placement Capacity in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of Equity Securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period from 26 March 2025.

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the 47,058,824 Shares will be included in calculating the Company's 15% Placement Capacity in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of Equity Securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period from 26 March 2025.

7.3 Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.5

The following information must be provided to Shareholders for the purposes of obtaining Shareholder approval:

- (a) 47,058,824 Shares were issued to institutional, and sophisticated investors identified by the Company and its lead managers through a bookbuild process pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1. None of the participants in the Placement who were issued Placement Shares equal to more than 1% of the Company's issued capital (prior to the issue of the Placement Shares) were related parties of the Company, members of the Company's key management personnel, a substantial holder in the Company, or an adviser to the Company or an associate of any of those persons;

- (b) 47,058,824 Shares were issued pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1, ratification of which is sought pursuant to Resolution 4;
- (c) the Placement Shares are fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company and rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue;
- (d) 47,058,824 Shares were issued at an issue price of \$0.85 per Share, raising approximately \$40,000,000 (before costs);
- (e) 47,058,824 Shares were issued on 2 and 3 April 2025;
- (f) proceeds raised from the issue of the Placement Shares have been used for development activities at the Company's Kasiya Rutile-Graphite Project, located in Malawi, including permitting, studies, general working capital, and other corporate purposes;
- (g) the Placement Shares were issued under short form subscription letters pursuant to which the Placement participants received Shares at an issue price of \$0.85 per Share; and
- (h) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice for Resolution 4.

7.4 Board recommendation

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

If the Shareholder is entitled to cast 2 or more votes at the Meeting the Shareholder may appoint not more than 2 proxies. Where the Shareholder appoints more than one proxy the Shareholder may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If such proportion or number of votes is not specified each proxy may exercise half of the Shareholder's votes. A proxy may, but need not be, a Shareholder of the Company.

If a Shareholder appoints a body corporate as the Shareholder's proxy to attend and vote for the Shareholder at that Meeting, the representative of the body corporate to attend the Meeting must produce the Certificate of Appointment of Representative prior to admission. A form of the certificate may be obtained from the Company's share registry.
