QUARTERLY REPORT ENDED 31 MARCH 2026

Talonx Resources Limited (**ASX: TXR**, “Talonx” or “the Company”) is pleased to report on its quarterly activities for the period ending 31 March 2026.

HIGHLIGHTS

- RC drilling results returned for maiden RC campaign at the Viking Gold Project
- Results confirm continuity of high-grade gold mineralisation at Beaker 2

CORPORATE

- New Company type, name and ASX code came into effect from 2 January 2026

JUNE QUARTER 2026 – PLANNED ACTIVITIES

- Maiden RC drilling program at the Blair North gold project (commenced subsequent to the end of quarter)
- RC drilling at the Viking Gold Project, testing high-grade gold targets at the Beaker 2 and Beaker 4 prospects
- Ongoing engagements on the future of the Kihabe Project

Viking Gold Project

The Viking Gold Project comprises 66km² of granted tenure situated within the Albany–Fraser Province, a high-grade metamorphic terrane dominated by gneisses and reworked granitoids. Primary gold mineralisation intersected at Viking is associated with moderately east dipping quartz veins within discrete shear zones in a granite host. The Beaker 2 prospect is the highest priority target and hosts a significant high-grade supergene zone which the Company has targeted with its maiden RC drilling program.

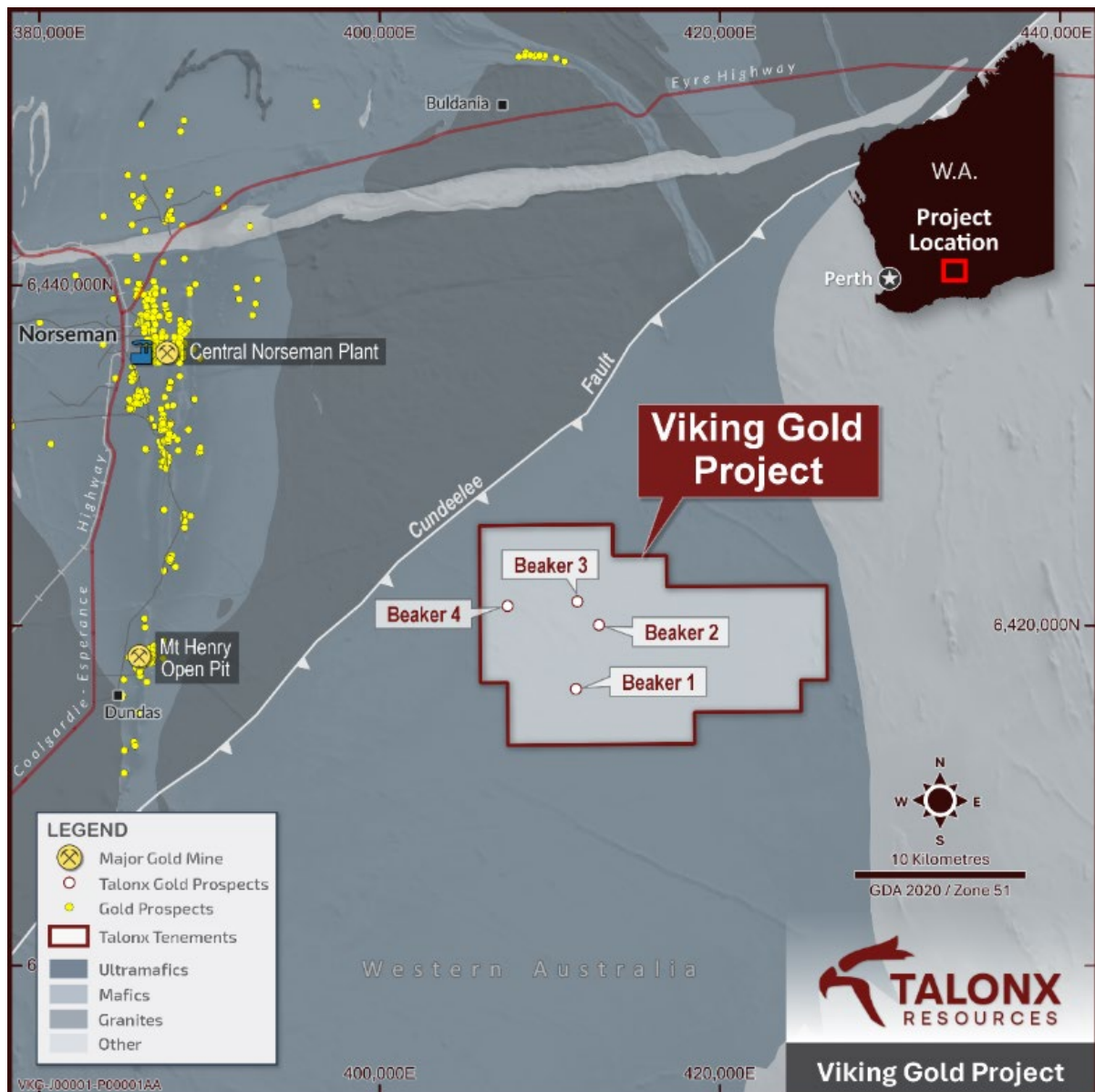


Figure 1. Viking Gold Project showing location of the Beaker gold prospects

The initial 10-hole, 867m RC drilling program completed by Talonx in December 2025, was designed primarily to evaluate the resource potential of the high-grade, shallow oxide gold zone at Beaker 2. The positive results returned from the program validate historical drilling and demonstrate continuity of shallow oxide gold mineralisation both along strike and down dip, confirming Beaker 2 as a coherent near-surface gold system with potential to support future resource definition drilling.

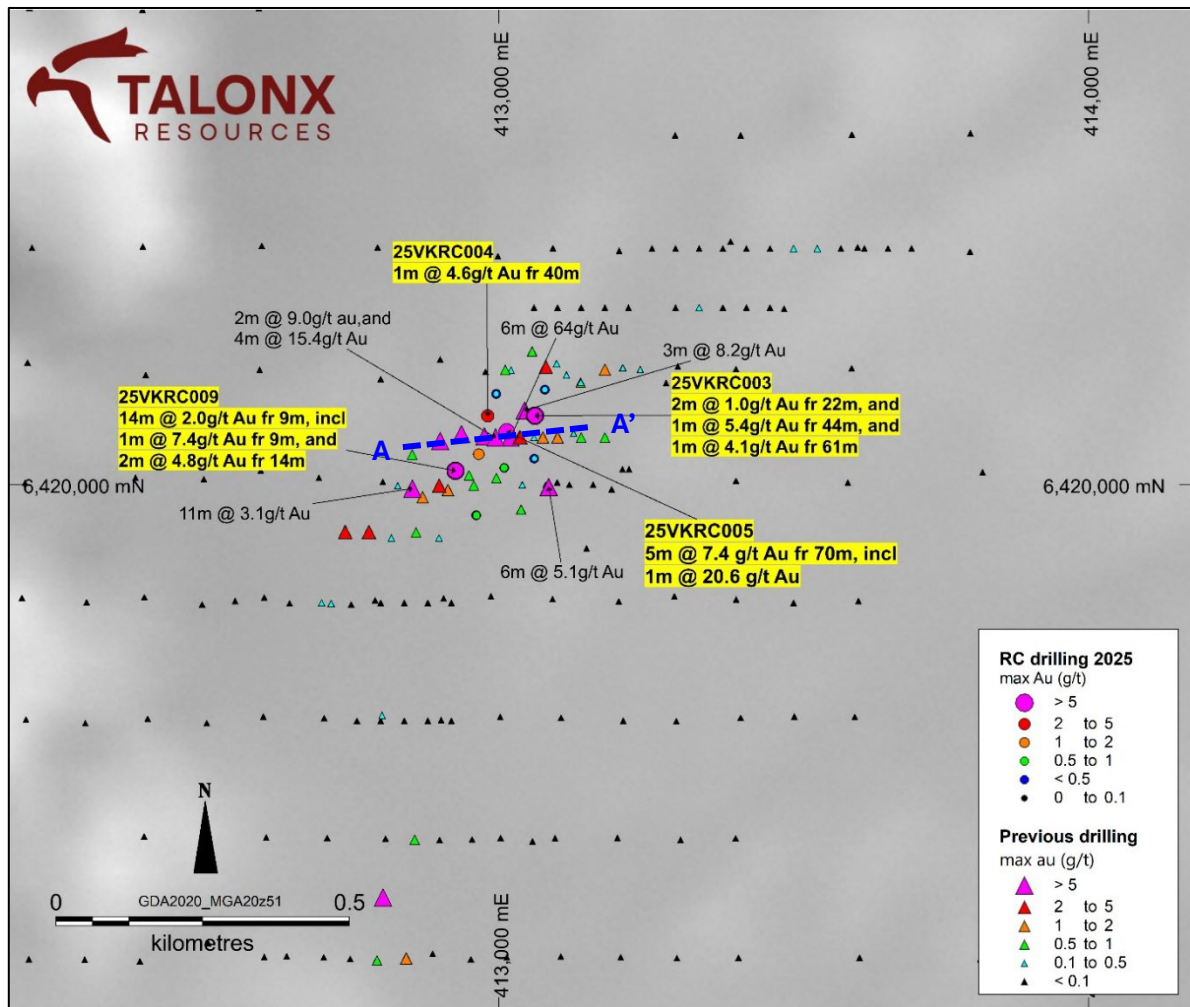


Figure 2. RC result highlights from Talonx drilling at Beaker 2

RC drilling at Viking is scheduled to recommence in April 2026, with priority follow-up holes planned at Beaker 2 and initial drilling to commence at the Beaker 4 prospect.

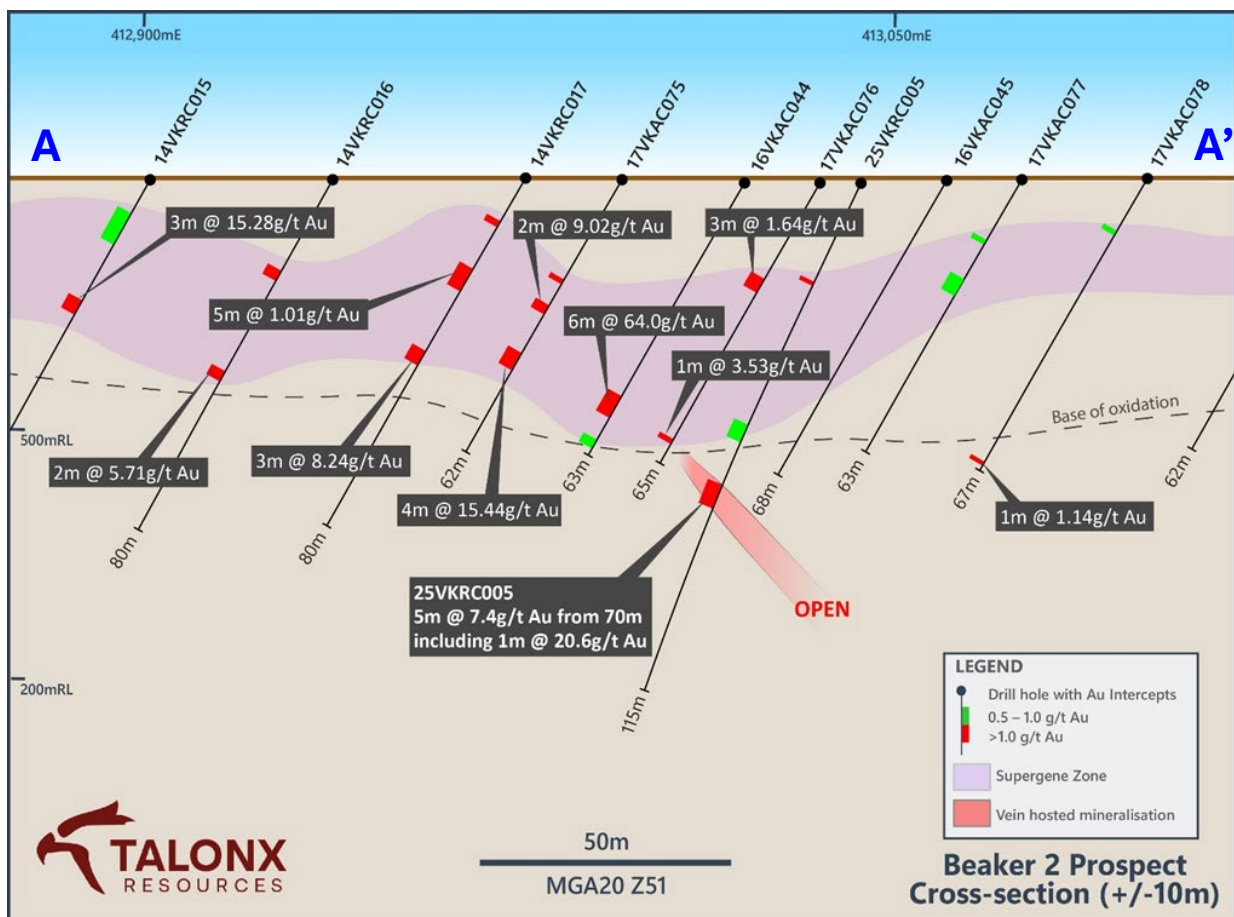


Figure 3. Beaker 2 Prospect cross-section (Looking north on 6420080mN +/- 10m)

Blair North Project

The Blair North Project is located 25km east of Kalgoorlie, surrounded by established operations and gold deposits. The project has been explored recently by Metal Hawk Limited who successfully identified nickel sulphide and primary gold mineralisation at the Commodore and Commodore North prospects. The project offers drill-ready targets along strike and at depth at the Commodore prospects, in addition to numerous other untested targets currently being reviewed.

During the quarter planning was finalised for the Company's maiden 1,800m RC drilling program at Blair North. Subsequent to the end of the quarter drilling commenced and results will be released as soon as available.

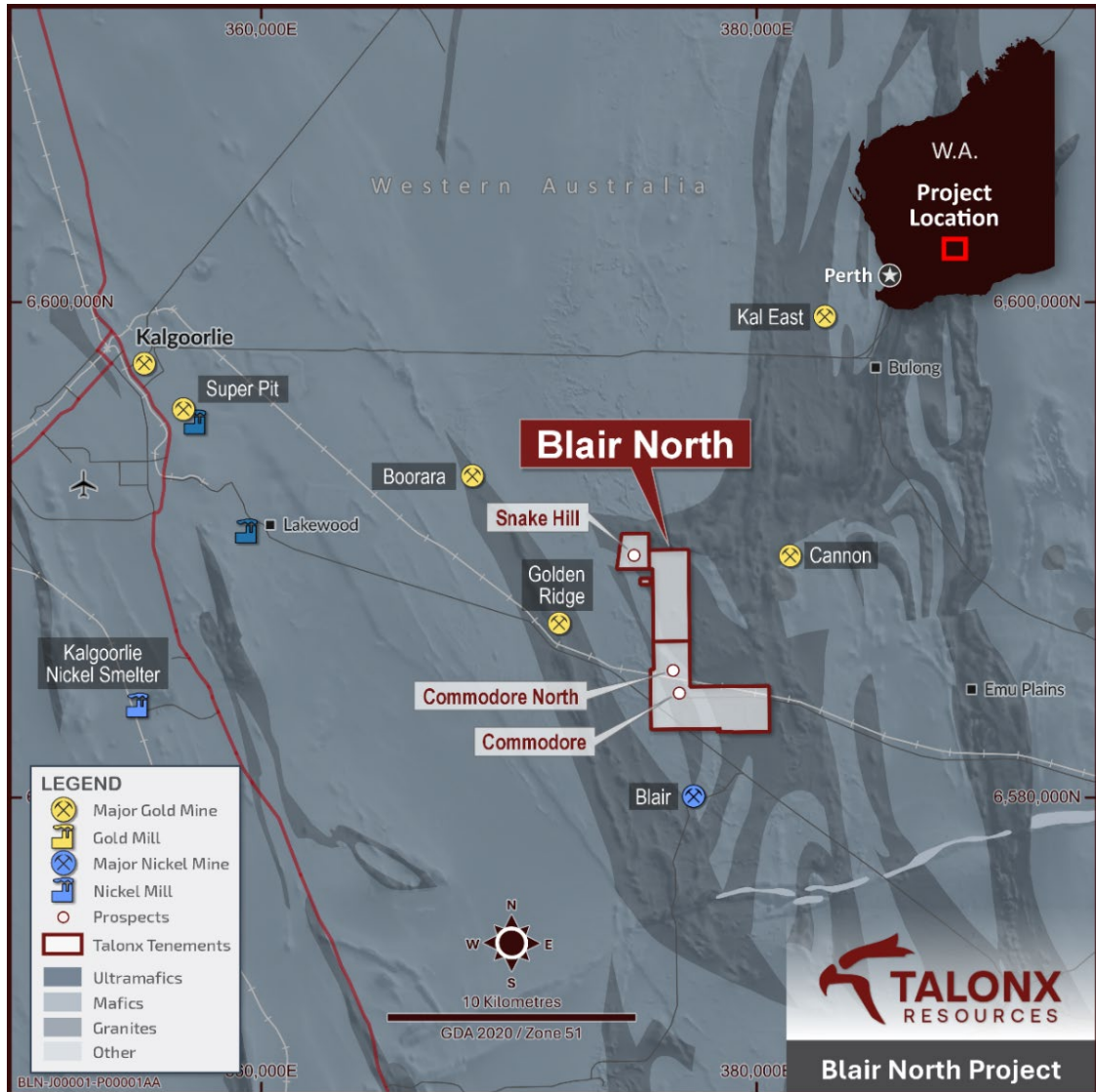


Figure 4. Blair North project map showing key gold prospects

Kihabe Project – Botswana

Further internal geological analysis of the project has validated significant potential for Zn-Pb mineralisation across the broader project area, which remains substantially underexplored beyond the two existing resource areas at Nxuu and Kihabe. Regional copper potential has also been assessed, with the conclusion that further Cu exploration is not warranted at this time.

Talonx is currently evaluating its options for the project, including a potential divestment, and welcomes enquiries from interested parties.

CORPORATE

In March 2026, Talonx raised A\$750,000 through a placement of 75 million fully paid ordinary shares at A\$0.10 per share, with the majority of proceeds directed toward drilling programs at the Viking and Blair North projects.

OTHER

During the quarter ended 31 March 2026:

- The Company made cash payments of \$10,000 to related parties and their associates. This was the aggregate amount paid to the Directors including salary, directors' fees, and superannuation.
- The Company spent approximately \$142,000 on project and exploration activities primarily relating to RC drilling at the Viking project, reported above.
