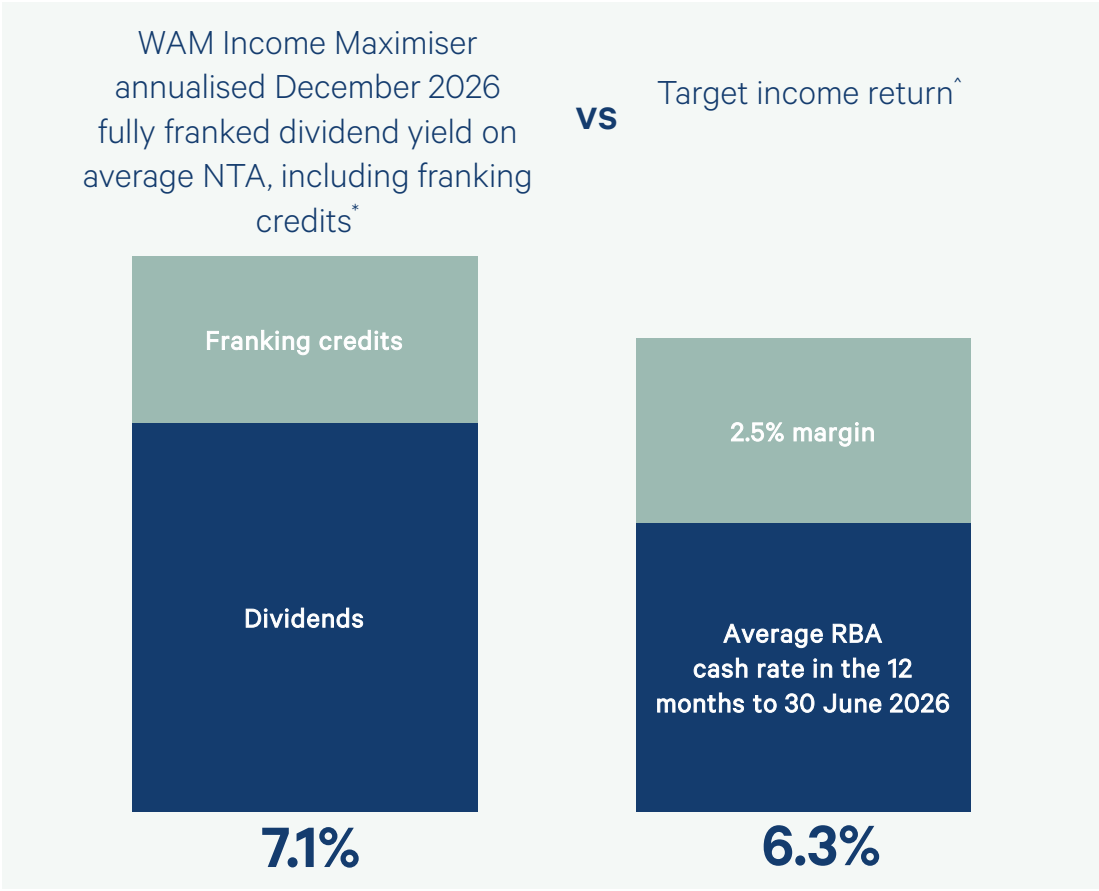

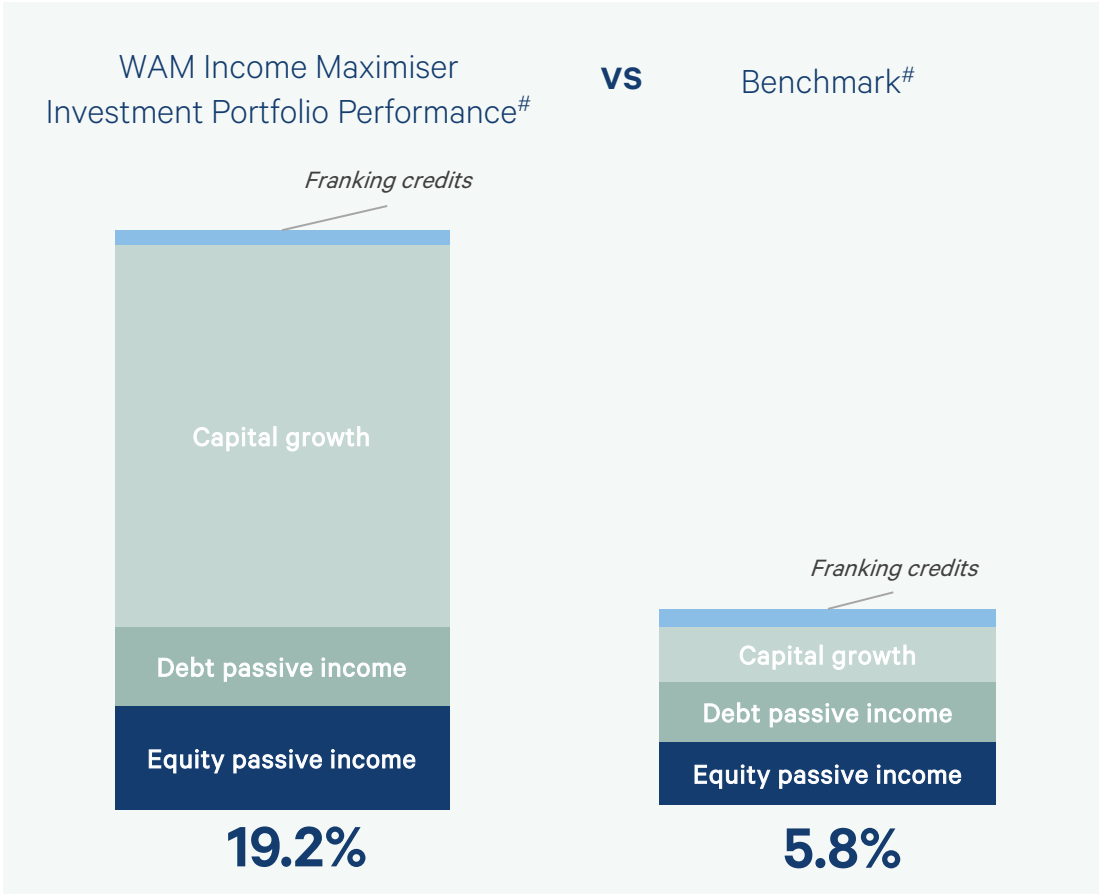
Exceeding target income and outperforming benchmark

2 Capital growth: Investment portfolio outperforming benchmark

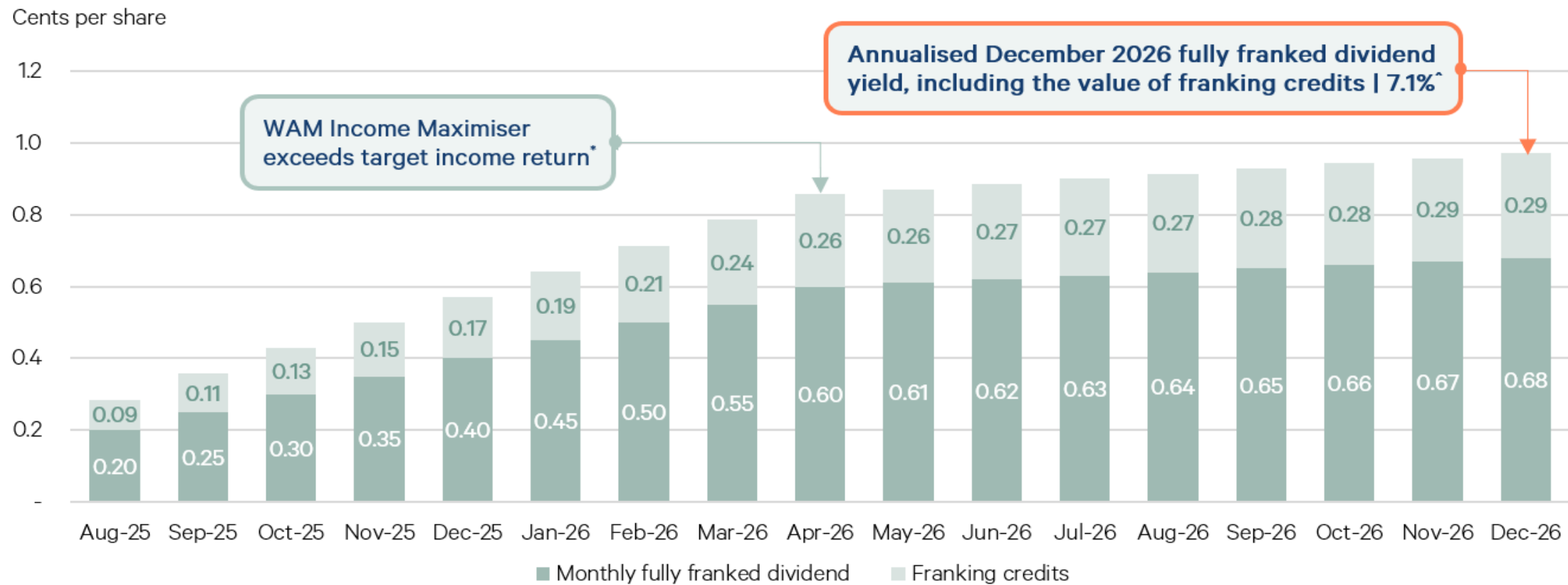

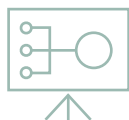

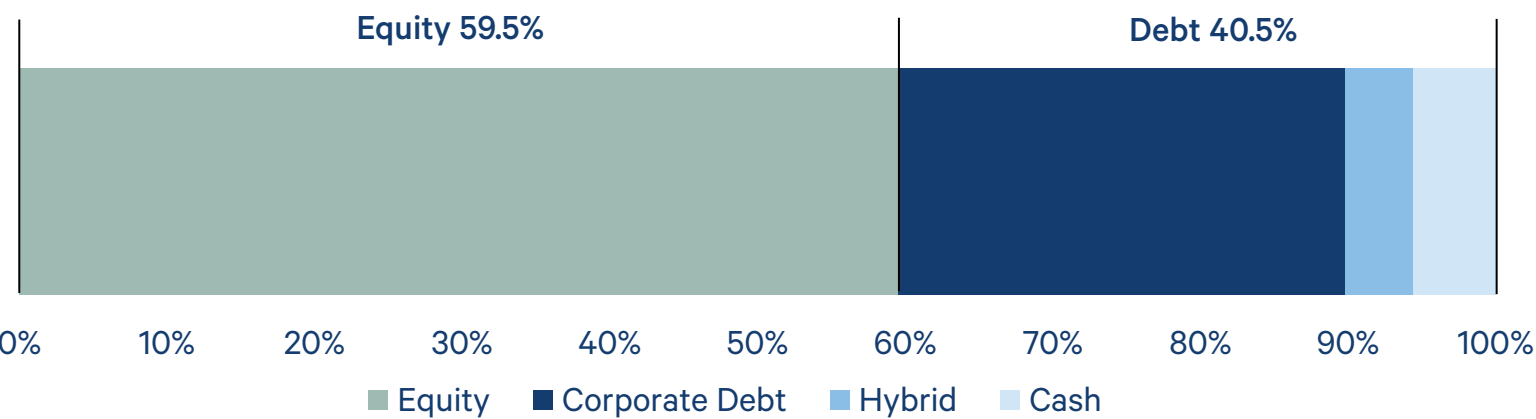
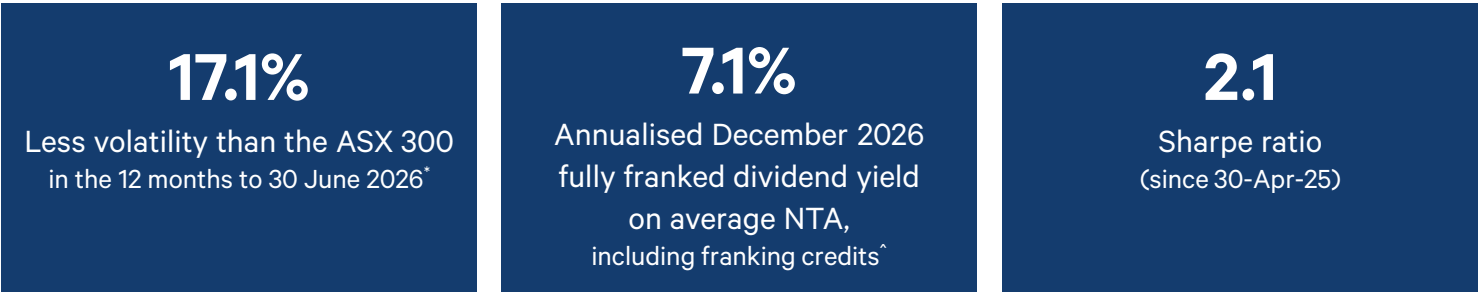

Offer Structure

- Entitlement Offer comprises a pro-rata non-renounceable offer of two (2) New Shares for every five (5) existing shares in WAM Income Maximiser Limited (ASX: WMX) to eligible shareholders* at an issue price of \$1.62 per New Share, a 5.5% discount to the current share price[^]. The issue price is equal to the Company's estimated pre-tax net tangible asset (NTA) backing as at 24 July 2026, less the August 2026 fully franked dividend of 0.64 cents per share.
- Shareholders who take up their entitlement in full may also apply for Additional New Shares under a Top-Up Facility, subject to any scale back. The allocation of any New Shares under the Top-Up Facility remains at the sole discretion of the Company.
- The Company undertook a bookbuild process under which certain wholesale investors were invited to apply for New Shares. Strong demand resulted in the bookbuild closing early and allocations subject to scale back, and WAM Income Maximiser raised the maximum amount available of \$47.0 million under the Placement. Any New Shares available under the Shortfall Offer will be allocated from that bookbuild process, to accommodate that additional investor demand.
- The Placement is pursuant to the Company's available placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1. The price per New Share under the Placement is at the same price as the Entitlement Offer.
- New Shares issued under the Entitlement Offer, Top-Up Facility, Shortfall Offer and Placement will rank pari passu with existing WAM Income Maximiser shares on issue from their date of issue.
- Shareholders who participate in the Entitlement Offer will do so without incurring any brokerage costs and New Shares will receive monthly fully franked dividends subsequent to and including the September 2026 fully franked dividend of 0.65 cents per share, or 0.93 cents per share when including the value of franking credits^{**}.

How to participate in the Entitlement Offer:

- An Offer Booklet containing further details of the Entitlement Offer (including eligibility criteria and how to participate) is expected to be released to the ASX and dispatched or made available to eligible shareholders* on Wednesday 5 August 2026.
- Eligible shareholders* can apply for New Shares in excess of their entitlement in the Entitlement Offer under the Top-Up Facility.
- Applications to subscribe for New Shares in the Entitlement Offer or Top-Up Facility can be submitted by returning a completed Entitlement and Acceptance Form or by making payment via BPAY or EFT – further instructions will be contained in the Offer Booklet.
- WAM Income Maximiser's share registry, Boardroom Pty Limited, will email application forms and the Entitlement Offer Booklet to eligible shareholders* who have elected not to receive communications electronically. This email will come from companies@boardroomlimited.com.au.

Shortfall Offer and Placement[^]:

The Company completed a bookbuild process, under which certain wholesale investors were invited to apply for New Shares. That bookbuild attracted strong support from both existing professional and sophisticated shareholders[#] and new wholesale investors, closing early, with allocations subject to scale back. Demand for the bookbuild was overwhelming and significantly in excess of amounts available under the Placement and Entitlement Offer, and the Company raised the maximum amount available of \$47.0 million under the Placement.

The Company will therefore place any New Shares available under the Shortfall Offer (being those not subscribed for under the Entitlement Offer or Top-Up Facility) with investors who participated in the bookbuild process, at the same price and under the same terms as the Entitlement Offer. There will be no general public offer of New Shares under the Shortfall Offer, as it is not available to retail investors.

This section identifies the areas the Directors regard as the main risks associated with an investment in the Company. Eligible Shareholders should be aware that an investment in the Company involves many risks, which may be higher than the risks associated with an investment in other companies. Specific Risks

Dilution of existing Shareholdings in the Company	Shareholders who do not take up their Entitlements in full will have their percentage interest in the Company reduced. The exact amount of dilution will depend on the level of shareholder participation. Given the structure of the Entitlement Offer (2 New Shares for every 5 existing Shares held at the Record Date) this will mean that the dilution to existing Shareholders who do not take up their Entitlements in full may be significant. Debt instrument risk	The Company invests in bonds and other types of debt instruments and securities, the key area of focus are investment grade corporate notes and bonds, hybrids and short-term money market instruments. Changes in interest rates generally will cause the value of fixed rate debt instruments to vary inversely to such changes. 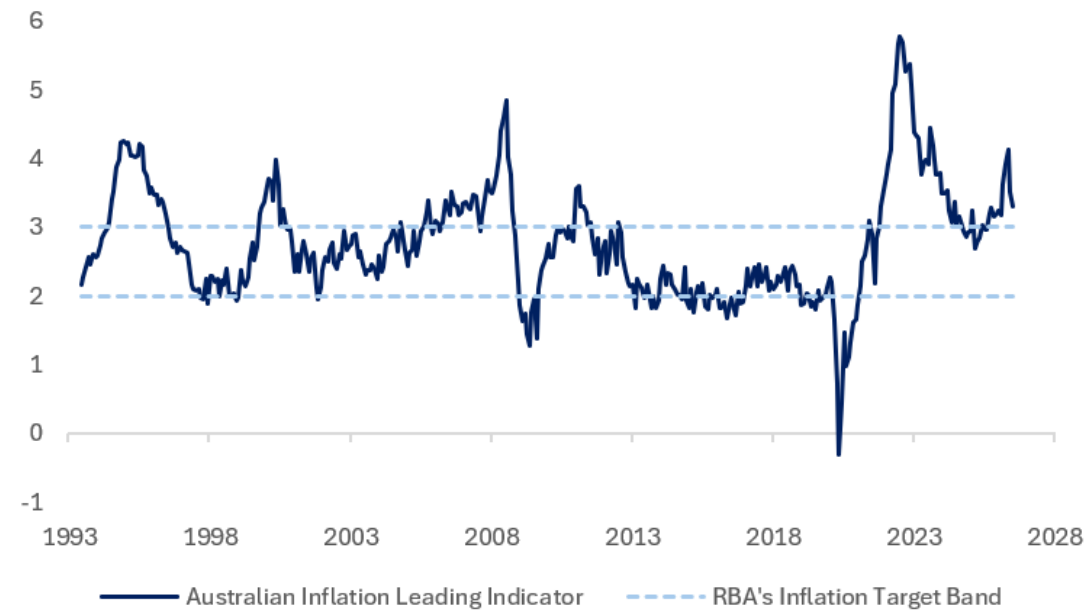

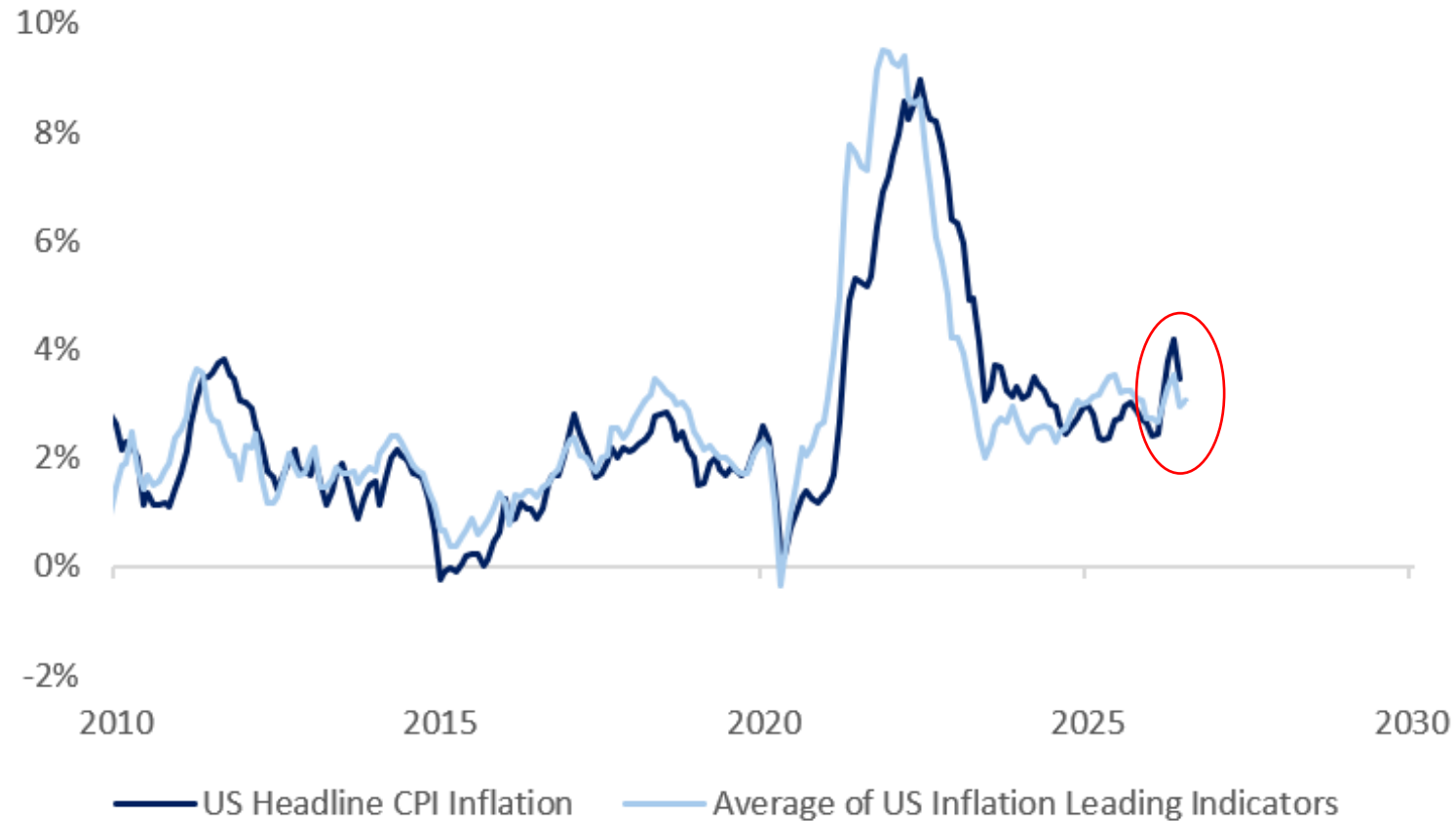
