Quarterly Activities Report**Q1 FY27 headlines:**

- **Wingara reports a 30 June 2026 cash position of \$74k;**
- **Continued progress on domestic hay trading and agricultural logistics opportunities; and**
- **Appointment of Christopher Hood as Chief Executive Officer.**

Wingara AG Limited (ASX: WNR), is pleased to provide its 30 June 2026 quarter's activities report alongside its Appendix 4C (Quarterly Cashflow Report) for the three months ended 30 June 2026 (Q1 FY27).

During the quarter, Wingara continued its operational and corporate reset following the completion Epsom lease in February 2026 and the earlier cessation of export hay processing operations. The Company focused on resolving remaining legacy obligations and preserving cash while rebuilding activity through domestic hay trading, storage coordination and agricultural logistics management.

As part of its focus on rebuilding its domestic hay trading and adjacent services the board and management assessed opportunities to source suitable hay and fodder from Victoria and South Australia for supply into New South Wales and Queensland, including into cattle producers, feedlots, saleyards, processors and other livestock and animal-protein businesses with recurring fodder requirements.

Subsequent to quarter end, Wingara appointed Queensland-based agricultural and logistics executive Christopher Hood as Chief Executive Officer, effective 17 July 2026. Mr Hood's appointment supports the execution of Wingara's existing agricultural trading and logistics strategy and will directly feed into the activities undertaken by the board to development opportunities to supply hay and fodder from southern producing regions into Queensland and New South Wales.

Mr Hood has commenced a review of the Company's operating strategy and will consult with growers, customers, storage and transport providers, shareholders and other key stakeholders. He expects to complete this review and present his vision for Wingara's operating strategy at the Company's next Annual General Meeting, including the longer-term development of Wingara as an agriculture-focused trading and logistics business and the provision of value-added and containerised logistics services where commercially appropriate.

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 4.7C.3, payments to related parties and their associates outlined in the Company's Appendix 4C for the quarter relate to fees and salaries paid to Directors.
