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Quarterly Activities Report – June 2026

Battery, base and precious metals exploration company Yugo Metals Limited (**ASX:YUG**) (**Yugo** or the **Company**) is pleased to provide its activities report for the quarter ended 30 June 2026.

Highlights:

- **Maiden drill campaign intersects encouraging gold results at Erak Prospect (Sinjakovo Project). Five drillholes drilled at Erak to date, results received for first three holes. Best result 8m @ 1.2 g/t Au from 26.1m depth. Drilling is ongoing.**
- **Post-quarter: Preparation for drilling at Cajnice Project. The planned drilling will test the depth extension of outcrops containing gold-silver-lead mineralisation of up to 1.9g/t Au, 220g/t Ag and 13.6% Pb with four initial diamond drillholes.**
- **\$5.0M Placement completed to accelerate drilling across all three Projects: Sinjakovo (gold), Sockovac (nickel/cobalt) and Cajnice (base metals)**

Sinjakovo Project

Five diamond drillholes have been completed at Erak Prospect to date, for the total 632m length of drilling.

All drillholes have intersected mineralised alteration zone. This zone is layer-parallel, brecciated, strongly overprinted with “phyllic” (silica-sericite-pyrite) alteration¹. The widths of alteration are between 3m (in hole ERDD003 drilled in the western part of drilling area) and 34m (in drillhole ERDD006 in the eastern part).

Drilling has also intersected breccia with Au-Ag-Cu-Sb mineralisation up to 8m @ 1.2 AuEq g/t, including 4m @ 0.5g/t Au + 40g/t Ag + 0.6% Cu + 0.25% Sb.

Drilling is ongoing, with two more drillholes planned to test the extensions of mineralisation along strike to east and down-dip to north. Then, the drilling rig will relocate to east part of Erak Prospect, to the location of the best trench result to date (61m @ 1.5g/t Au)².

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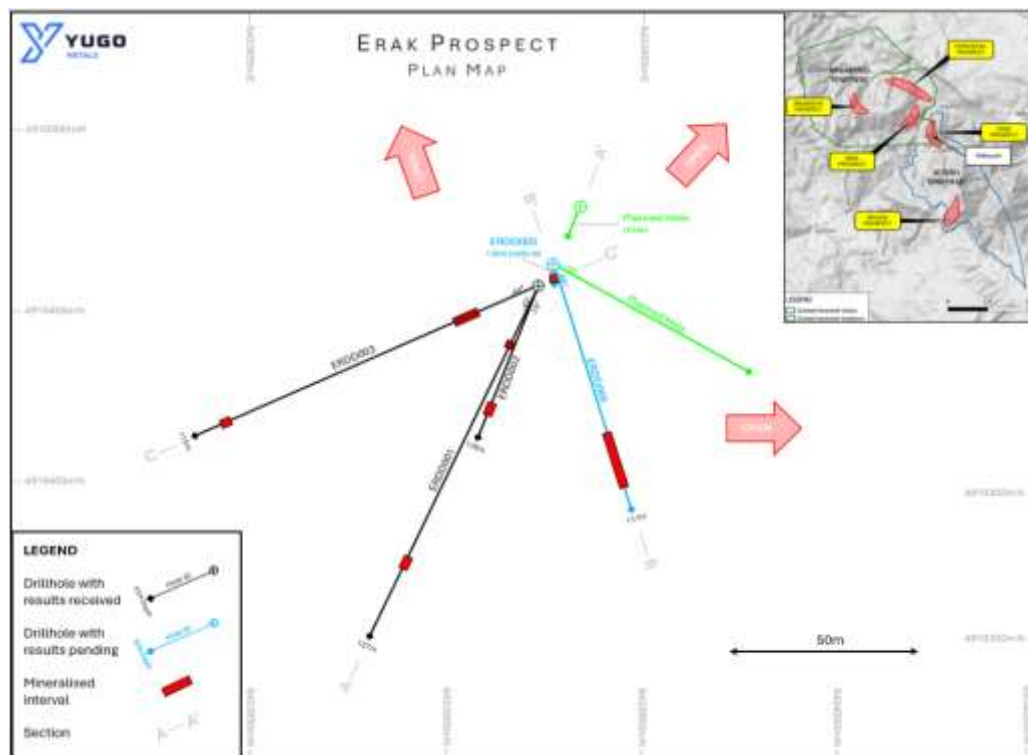


Figure 1 Erak Prospect (Sinjakovo Project), plan map showing drilling program

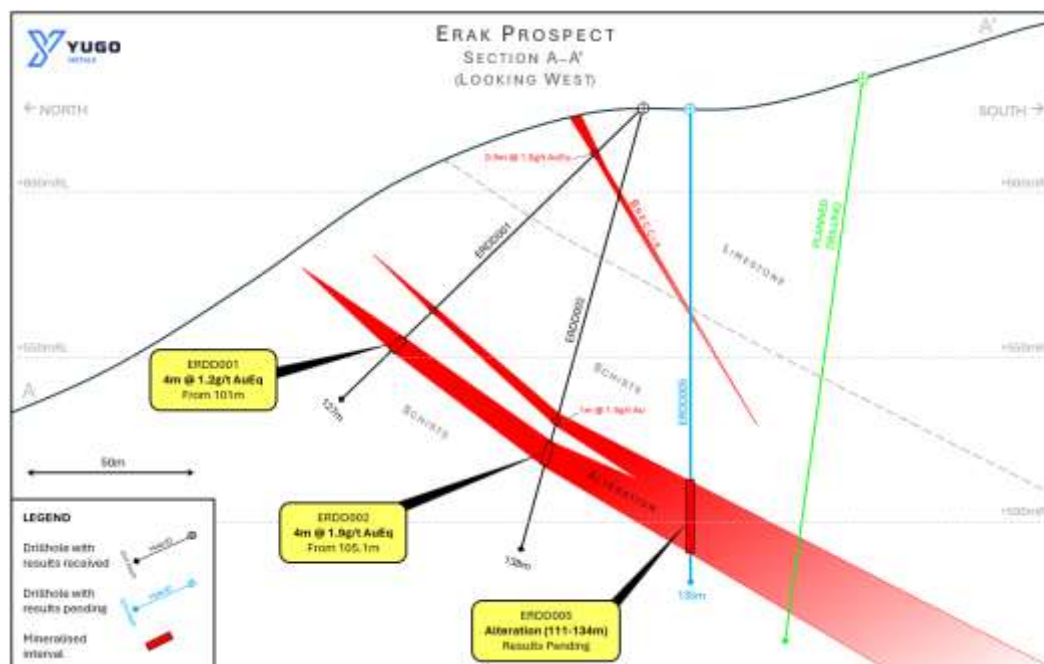


Figure 2: Erak Prospect (Sinjakovo Project), drilling cross-section A-A'

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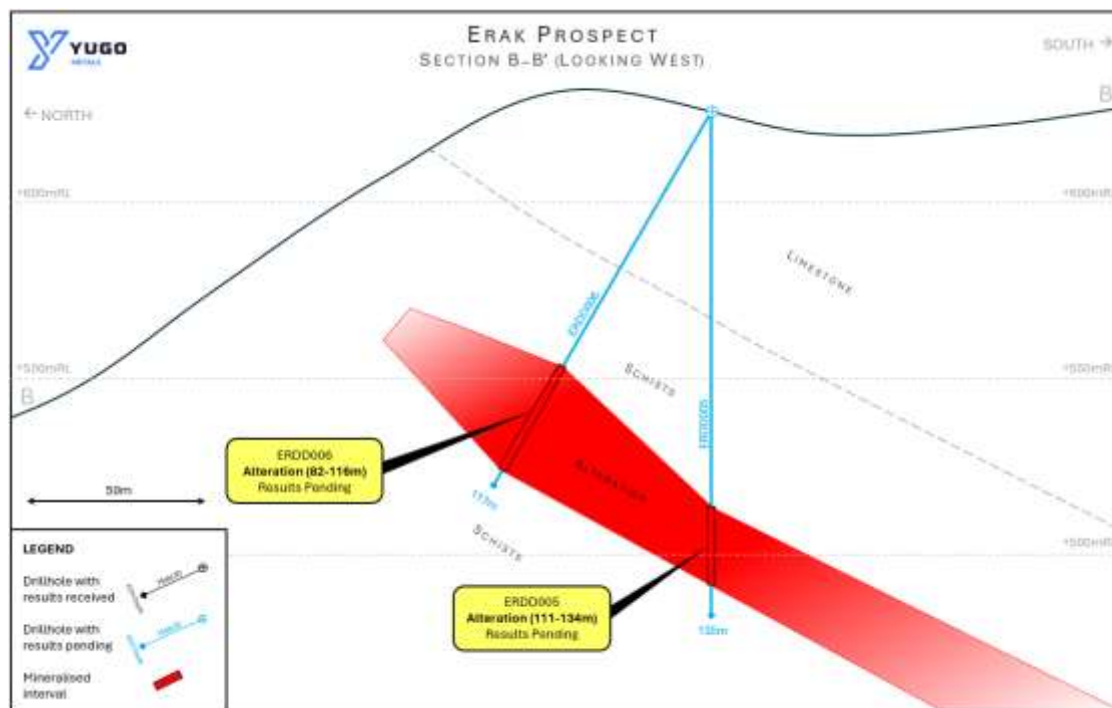


Figure 3: Erak Prospect (Sinjakovo Project), drilling cross-section B-B'

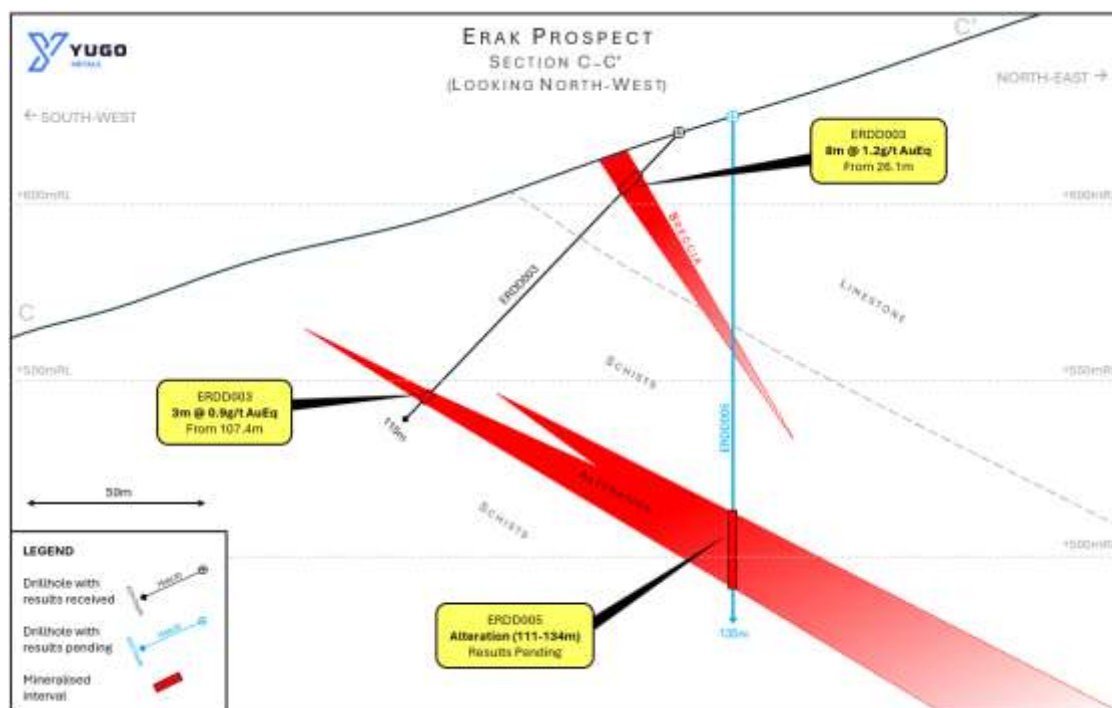


Figure 4: Erak Prospect (Sinjakovo Project), drilling cross-section C-C'

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Cajnice Project

Four initial diamond drillholes, totalling approximately 600m, are planned at the Cajnice Project. Drilling is planned at the Majdan and Pisonica prospects.

The planned drilling will test the depth extension of outcrops containing gold-silver-lead mineralisation of up to 1.9g/t Au, 220g/t Ag and 13.6% Pb³. This mineralisation is hosted in silicified layers within sediments, in the zone near the felsic intrusives (granites, monzonites and aplites). Additional drilling is subject to results intersected in initial drillholes.

Further drilling details will be announced during the upcoming quarter.

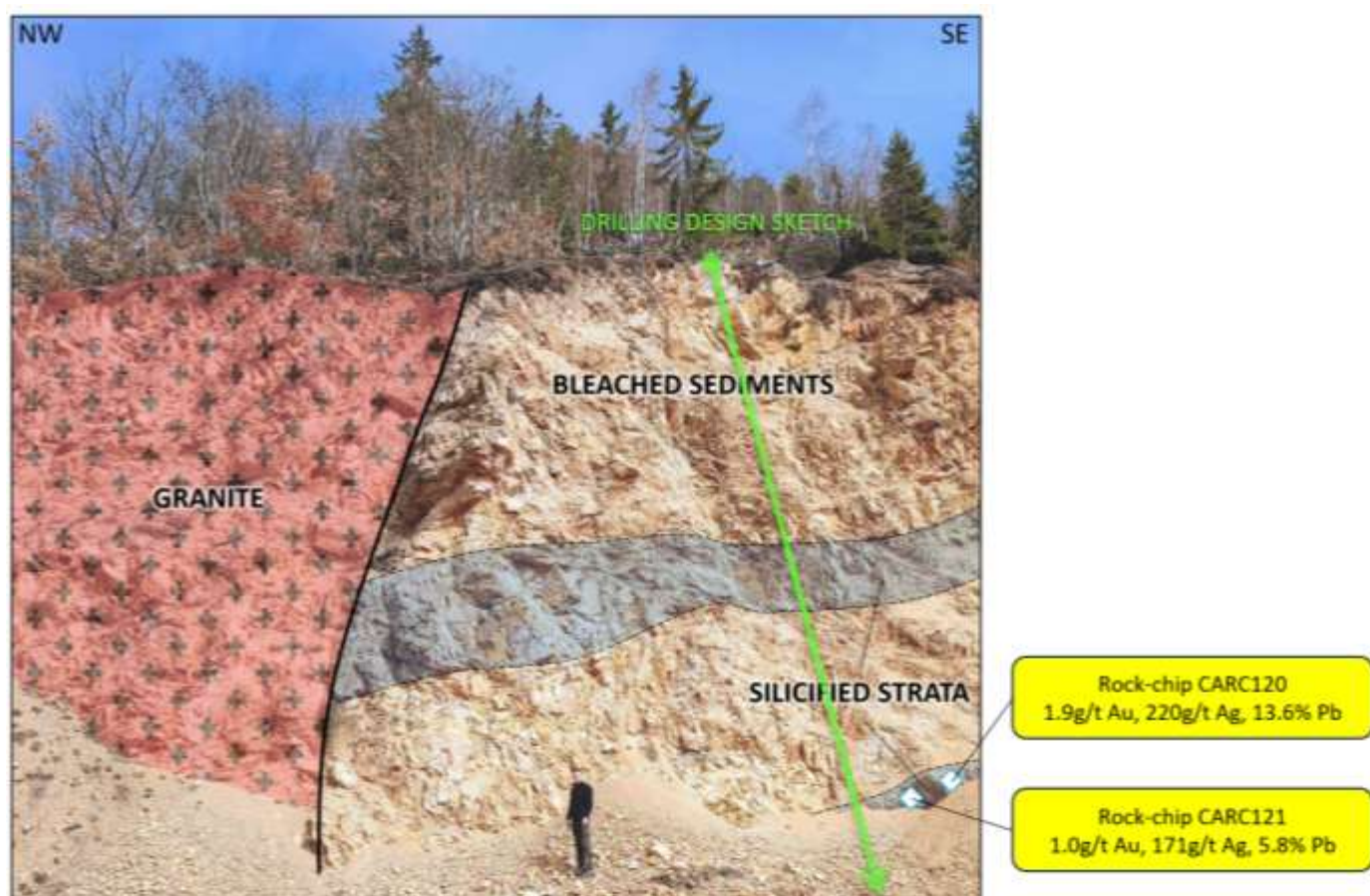


Figure 5: Cajnice Project, Majdan Au-Ag-Pb Prospect, photo of cliff profile

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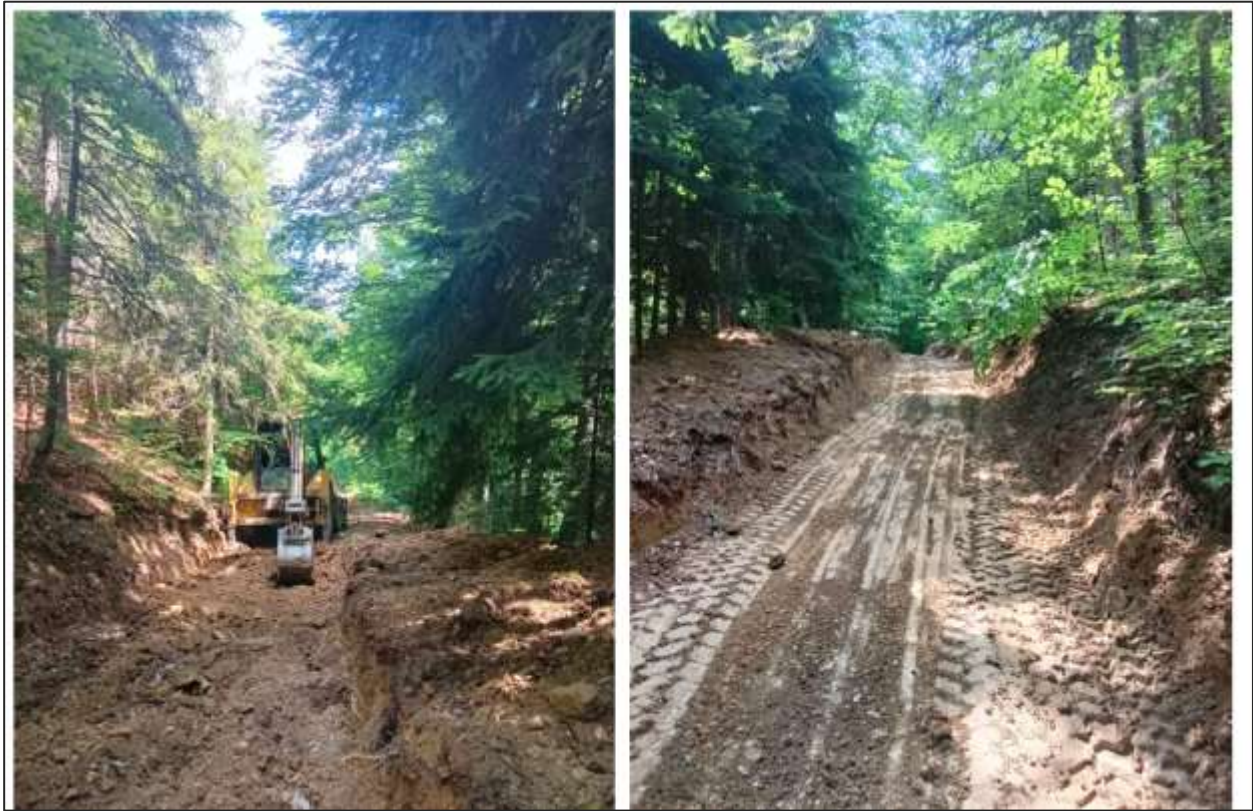


Figure 6: Cajnice Project, Pisonica Ag-Pb-Zn Prospect, photos of forest track repairs for drill site access

Sockovac Project

The “Petrovo” tenement was granted to Yugo earlier in 2026, after the successful completion of consultations with the local community and the Government.

The Petrovo tenement (10km²) encompass the area with the historical (1969) significant shallow drilling results on nickel (5.1m @ 6.6% Ni from 57.9m depth; cobalt not analysed) and zinc+lead (9.35m @ 8.2% Zn+Pb from 41.8m depth; silver and gold not analysed)⁴, and recently identified gold-silver mineralisation on surface with rock-chip results up to 5.7g/t gold and 1,330g/t silver⁵.

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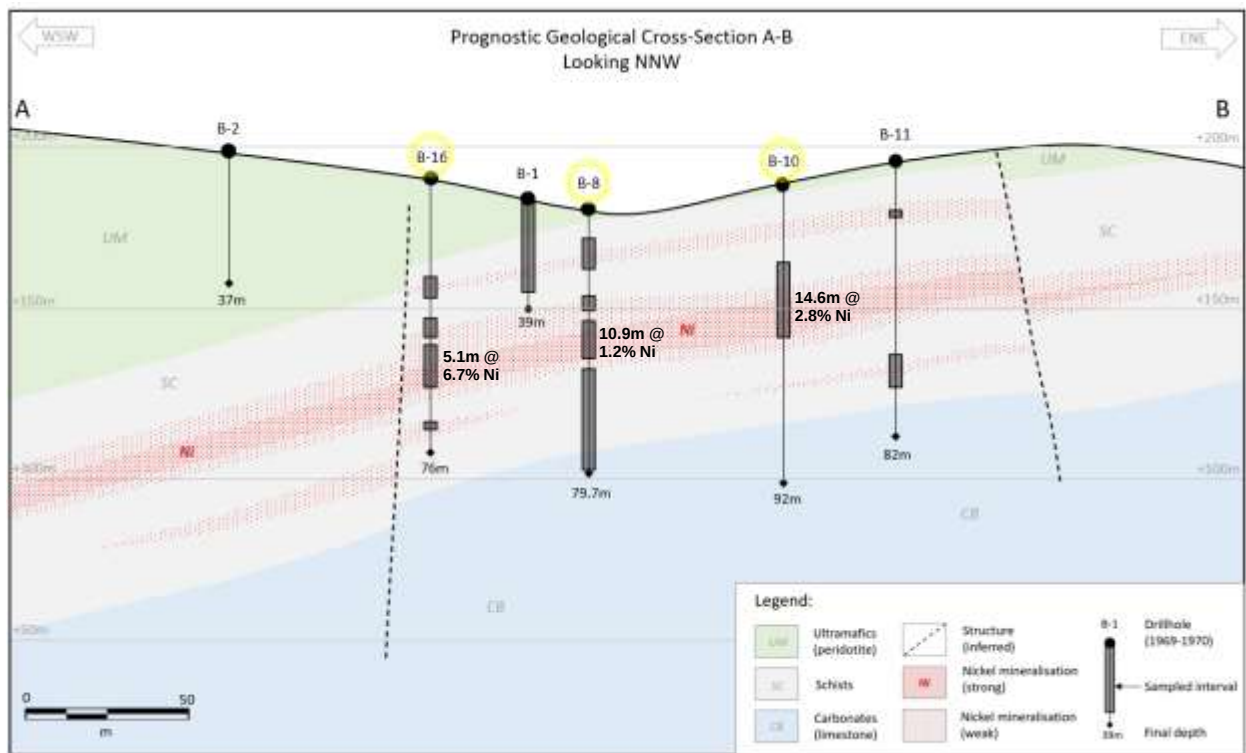


Figure 7: Sockovac (Petrovo) cross-section showing historical drill holes with interpreted geology

In addition, the Company is continuing to actively explore various prospects and assessing potential acquisitions in tier 1 jurisdictions that would be complimentary to the Company's asset portfolio and enhance shareholder value.

Corporate

Cash position and capital raise completed

The Company had a cash balance of approximately \$6.3 million as of 30 June 2026.

During the quarter the Company completed a Placement of 52,083,333 fully paid ordinary shares at A\$0.096 per share (Placement Shares) to raise \$5,000,000 (before costs).

CPS Capital Group Pty Ltd acted as Lead Manager to the Placement (refer to the Company's Appendix 3B lodged on 2 June 2026 for details on the Lead Manager fees).

On 25 May 2026 the Company appointed Mr Craig McNab as Non-Executive Director following the resignation of Mr Mihajlo Matkovic.

On 3 June 2026 the Company appointed Mr Cameron Peacock as Non-Executive Director.

Exploration licences

At the end of the quarter Yugo held a 100% interest in exploration licences in three project areas located in Bosnia and Herzegovina:

- **Sinjakovo (including Sinjakovo and Jezero tenements) – approximately 81km²**
- **Sockovac (including Petrovo¹ and Doboј tenements) – approximately 60km²**
- **Cajnice (including Cajnice tenement only) – approximately 50km²**

There have been no changes in the interests in exploration licenses during the quarter.

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 5.3.2, Yugo confirms that its activities were restricted to exploration only and that it did not conduct any mining development or production activities during the quarter. In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 5.3.1: Exploration and Evaluation expenditure during the quarter was \$453,000.
